The Feast of Mercy, Divine Mercy Sunday Sunday, April 8^{th,} 3 – 4 pm Celebration of Divine Mercy

Join us on Sunday, April 8th from 3:00-4:00 pm for prayer meditation & praise including the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, singing of The Divine Mercy Chaplet, a talk, a few songs, litany to the Divine Mercy and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament, Father Stan will also be available for individual confessions during this time. Your Lenten confession does count toward the indulgence as well as going to confession afterward.

Jesus told St. Faustina that this Feast of Mercy would be a very special day when "all the divine floodgates through which graces flow are opened". Our Lord made a great promise to all those souls who would go to confession and then receive Him in Holy Communion on the Feast of Mercy, on the Sunday after Easter, which is now called Divine Mercy Sunday throughout the Catholic church. Jesus promised that "The soul that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain the complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." He went on to say "I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My Mercy." THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Acts 3:13-15, 17-19Turn to God that your sins may be wiped away.1 John 2:1-5We can be sure of him if we keep his commandments.Luke 24:35-48Penance for the remission of sins is to be preached to all nations.

In his epistle John has harsh words for those who profess knowledge of Jesus Christ without keeping his commandments. Our bishops echo his statement when they say that words must be accompanied by deeds. In Luke's gospel Jesus exhorts his followers to preach penance for the remission of sins. The bishops respond to his command in this text.

As soon as a local church is established, Christ calls it to share the gospel it has received. Such sharing is essential for the church's vitality, since those who give life to others find it for themselves. So it was with Jesus throughout his life, and especially in his death and resurrection. Sharing is essential to every level of church life; it applies to dioceses and parishes as well as families and individuals.

What are the sessions about?

Session 1: Smart Loving

A proactive common sense approach to inviting more joy into our lives every day. This upbeat, three-hour session offers positive and affirming insights and fun couple exercises to help us love smarter not harder by prioritizing being in love. Gain clarity and freedom from our common "dumb loving" mistakes and fill out a special "gift registry" that will help you discover what makes your husband or wife feel most in love!

Session 2: The Passionate Couple

Take your relationship to the next level! This session offers a paradigm shift from just getting along to being passionately in love, not just for our own sake but for the sake of those around us. It offers keen insights that bridge the gap between how men and women prefer to achieve intimacy and empowers us to be a joyful sacramental couple.

Session 3: Talking with Purpose

This session offers simple strategies to help us avoid misunderstanding and teaches a powerful skill that can achieve an emotional connection so that we can feel close in any situation. Learn a fool proof process that can help a husband and wife to come together on any issue while still nurturing the tender atmosphere of being in love. This session can help us absolutely avoid ever having an argument and unleashes an aura of deep respect in our marriage. It will also guide us in discerning and directing our lives intentionally so that we can live in love the way we always dreamt we would.

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for the home April 8, 2018 – Second Sunday of Easter John 20:19-31

Behind locked doors, interesting things can happen, as they did to the disciples of Jesus after his Resurrection. There were two visits by the Risen Christ to them while they were still in Jerusalem. The first one had its own interesting dynamics. Without any warning, with the doors locked, Jesus was suddenly standing there in their midst. While his disciples were probably scared to death, Jesus greets them with a wish for them to be at peace. You can imagine that they were anything but peaceful at that moment.

Once all had settled down, Jesus got down to business. He was charging them with a mission: A mission that would include their being ambassadors for God. They would bring God's merciful forgiveness to those needing that gift.

This was a very important ministry for them. We humans often fail to do our best. Sometimes we even sin. Left alone in our sins, we can lose hope for ourselves and for a better tomorrow. Knowing that we are forgiven can release us to do better. God wants us to feel the touch of God's forgiveness and Jesus wants of his disciples to help in this mission.

Speaking of touch, we also learn about the late arrival of Thomas the apostle who has the unflattering name of "Doubting Thomas." Because that's my last name, people have occasionally accused me of doubting. Thomas the apostle does us a special service by showing us that Jesus is okay with doubters. He doesn't criticize Thomas for doubting. He even goes out of his way to help Thomas move from wondering doubt to wonderful faith.

Then we hear from the doubting one some of the most powerful words in the gospels. He looks at Jesus and with fully strengthened faith he says to Jesus, "My Lord and my God."

The word used here for "Lord" is the Greek word, *Kyrios*. It is a sacred word, reserved for God. Making this confession of faith has its own power. It is life giving. To admit that God is close to us, as Thomas declared, is quite an affirmation. It implies that God is not immeasurably distant from us, but rather, God is intimately close to us. God is present in the Eucharist but also present when we hear God's word, when we care for others in the name of God and when we pray to God.
