

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

Jesus points out to his disciples the poor widow who has just dropped two simple copper coins into the temple treasury. He then delivers a teaching on stewardship. Despite her poverty, the poor widow in today’s Gospel does not refuse God her generosity. Out of her desperately impoverished life she contributes to an earthly institution to give God glory and praise. It is not the monetary value of the gift that was important, but the love, trust and gratitude expressed through the gift. The Gospel asks us similarly compelling stewardship question: What do we value? In what or whom do we place our trust? How do our own contributions to our community of faith reflect our generosity toward God?

MARRIAGE MATTERS

A Little goes a Long Way

In this weekend's first reading, a destitute widow provides a cup of water and a small loaf of bread for the prophet Elijah, and her generosity is rewarded with a miracle. Her meager offering sustains them until the famine ends.

Like the widow, when we offer our spouse a small kindness from our limited stock, miracles often occur. Dr. Greg Popcak stresses "caretaking in conflict" as one of the hallmarks of a successful marriage. Next time you are arguing with your spouse:

- * Hold hands
- * Offer to bring him/her a drink or snack
- * Avoid placing blame
- * Use polite language

These difficult things pay off, and the miracle is that your spouse begins to believe that your relationship is more important than any issue that comes between you!

Daniel, 12:1-3 Those who lead us to justice shine like stars.
Hebrews 10:11-14,18 He has forever perfected those who are being sanctified.
Mark 13:24-32 Heaven and earth will pass away but my words will not.

For thousands of years humanity envisioned ultimate destruction at the hand of God. Now we know that we possess the power to destroy our world. God's word can save us-it is more powerful than all our nuclear arsenals-but we must listen and attend.


