Our Mission

Dedicated to providing safe, supportive housing and resources for unaccompanied homeless high school students in the Flathead Valley.

The Need:

- Montana Office of Public Instruction estimates 12.2% of high school students in Flathead County qualify as homeless under the Department of Education definition as outlined in the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.
- This means an estimated <u>350 students in Flathead County</u> "lack fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence."



Causes of Teen Homelessness:

- Cycle of chronic homelessness (> 1 yr.) beginning with parent/legal guardian
- Break down in family structure (parental incarceration, drug abuse, domestic violence)
- · Aging out of foster care system
- · Independent living due to gender or sexual preferences

Addressing the Need:

- Sparrow's Nest runs an eight bed home in Kalispell available to high school students in the Bigfork, Columbia Falls, Kalispell and Whitefish school districts. We differ from other organizations in that we strive to provide a long term home that is stable with a family style environment.
- Sparrow's Nest is <u>privately funded</u> and offers housing to these students at no cost beyond a
 commitment to finish their high school education. In Montana, 16 is when students can drop out of school
 and this is the average age of our residents. Their length of stay depends on their school attendance.
- Currently, we are the <u>first and only licensed residential facility</u> for unaccompanied homeless youth in Montana.

Our Future Goals:

- Better serve the needs of our homeless students by providing access to trained counselors
- · Improve care and well-being of our students
- · Expand our presence in the Flathead Valley

The Impact:

 We are <u>meaningfully changing lives</u> by giving these students the support they need to complete high school and become contributing members of society.


