
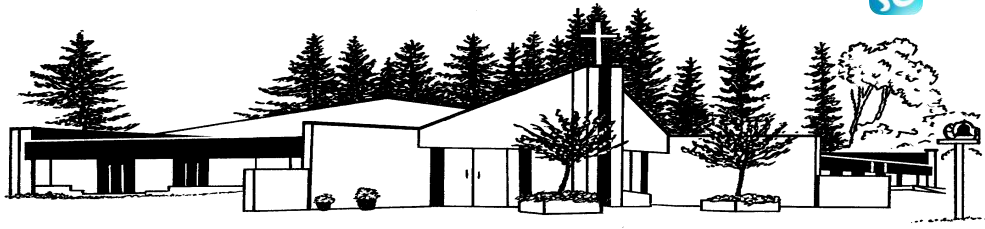

40 DAYS FOR LIFE

40 Days for Life began on Wednesday, September 26 at 7:00am in the public right-a-way in front of **All Families Healthcare 737 Spokane Avenue Whitefish, Montana**. Hours have changed this year to a 12-hour vigil instead of the 24-hour vigil that has been maintained in the past. The new hours are 7am – 7 pm, seven days per week. The link below provides instructions for individual participants to sign-up for 40 Days for Life to join the Whitefish campaign. An email is required for an individual participant to sign themselves up at **40daysforlife.com/local-campaigns/whitefish**. For those without emails, campaign leadership will need to sign you up so contact me at **kals40dfl@gmail.com**. While praying, please be sure that you are standing in front of **All Families Healthcare** and not in front of the building on the corner. It is easy to migrate. To simplify, be sure to stand between the wooden arch to the north and the large tree at the south end of the property. Also note that we are permitted to stand in the alley right of way (back entrance to abortion facility). Please do not block/obstruct vehicle or foot traffic. Best parking advice is to turn east on 8th Street and park along Kalispell Ave (1 block E) of Spokane. THE PASTORALS ON SUNDAY

A week-by-week resource from the Pastoral Letters of the Bishops' of Rome, of the Second Vatican Council, and of the Bishops' Conference of the United States

THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

1 Kings 17:10-16 The jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry.
Hebrews 9:24-28 Christ was offered up once to take away the sins of many.
Mark 12:38-44 They gave from their surplus; she gave from her want.

Today we hear of two women who gave even though they thought they had virtually nothing. Their faith told them that if they were generous, their basic needs would be met. Meeting the basic needs of the poor must be a priority for our nation. Contrast the widow in Mark's gospel with the scribes as described by Jesus. They seem almost comical compared to the dignity of the woman who quietly gave from her need.

The fulfillment of the basic needs of the poor is of the highest priority. Personal decisions, policies of private and public bodies, and power relationships must all be evaluated by their effects on those who lack the minimum necessities of nutrition, housing, education, and health care. In particular, this principle recognizes that meeting fundamental human needs must come before the fulfillment of desires for luxury consumer goods, for profits not conducive to the common good, and for unnecessary military hardware.

SPARROW'S NEST OF NORTHWEST MONTANA

SAVE THE DATE

On **Saturday December 8th**, Sparrow's Nest of Northwest Montana will host its fifth annual **"When the Night Comes"** fundraiser. Individuals participating in this sleep out raise money and awareness for the issue of unaccompanied high school homelessness in the Flathead County. Although it is an anonymous problem, the issue is pervasive with 12.2% of high school students across the valley qualifying as unaccompanied homeless under the parameters outlined by the Department of Education. Participants sleeping out in solidarity of the issue are asked to raise money in an effort to support the high school students with a demonstrated commitment to earning their diploma that reside in the Sparrow's Nest of Northwest Montana's home. We ask participants to experience one night of what the residents in our program faced on a daily basis before residing in the program's care.

This year's event will be hosted at **Trinity Lutheran Evangelical Church at 400 West California St, Kalispell, MT 59901**. "When the Night Comes" will begin with a soup kitchen at 5:00 PM and offer a community orientation on its mission and the students it serves at 5:45. Doors to the kitchen close at 6:15 PM.

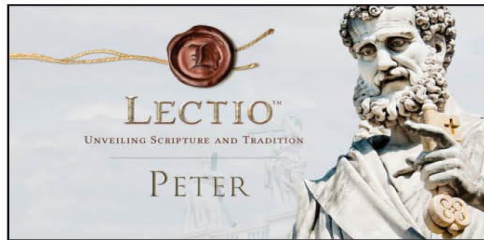
