PARISH INPUT PROCESS

Preparation for Part Two-Parish Input and Prioritization Process

Save the date!: Risen Christ Parish Social Area 6:30 pm on Sunday, October 8

As we gather we will review the feedback from throughout the Diocese that was gleaned from Part One of the Parish Input Process. That feedback reports on the initiatives that were recommended for inclusion in the next five-year Pastoral Plan and brings together the input from our parish and parishes throughout the Diocese as they met in the spring.

If you are not able to attend our session, you can submit your recommendations via email. The deadline to submit recommendations is Sunday, October 15. Below are the Parish Input Session Responses.

Parish Input Session Responses

The following items surfaced in Deaneries or, in some cases, throughout the Diocese, as items for consideration in the new five-year Diocesan Pastoral Plan.

- 1. Vocation Promotion Diocesan Priesthood:
 - a. Continue and enhance efforts to invite young men to consider a vocation to diocesan priesthood.
 - b. Encourage broader seminarian presence throughout the Diocese, especially in rural areas.
 - c. Explore ways to connect seminarians to youth and young adults.
 - d. Provide avenues for prayer support for those discerning a vocation/current seminarians.
- 2. Priestly Presence:
 - a. Promote resident priestly ministry (especially noted in rural parishes) to promote vital parish communities.
 - b. Provide programs and resources to enhance parish vitality.
 - c. Encourage parish priest's stability of assignment to build more long-term relationship/community at least through six year term.
- 3. Vocation Promotion Diaconate:
 - a. Increase awareness of the vocation of the Deacon.
 - b. Promote discernment of vocation to the Diaconate.
 - c. Start new deacon candidate invitation and formation class.
- 4. Vocation Promotion Religious Life:
 - a. Promote discernment and support of vocations to religious life women's and men's communities.
- 5. Diocesan Communication:
 - a. Provide information in a print communication format from the Bishop/Diocese on a regular basis (i.e. The Montana Catholic newspaper or other format). [note that a printed six-page Diocesan Newsletter (published six times yearly) began in May, 2017; mailed to all registered households]
 - b. Continue use of website and other technology that is regularly updated and accessible.
- 6. Adult Faith Formation:
 - a. Provide programs of Adult Faith Formation that are broadly accessible, include basic Catholic teaching and beliefs that provide background and training for parish involvement.
 - b. Provide Lay minister development and training.
 [Note: PFLM (2 year Lay Ministry training class) starts in Kalispell Deanery fall 2017l.
 - c. Initiate Diocesan sponsorship and promotion of hosted events: retreats, nationally known speakers, ministry enrichment opportunities.
- 7. Family Faith Formation:
 - a. Provide resources for programs that promote Family Faith Formation.

- 8. Youth Ministry/faith formation:
 - a. Continue the emphasis on Youth Faith Formation.
 - b. Reinstate a full-time Youth Minister.[Note: full-time Youth Minister added to Chancery staff in June 2017].
- 9. Young Adult Ministry/formation:
 - a. Increase outreach to young adults (single, families).
 - b. Promote outreach to Young Adults who are inactive Catholics.
 - c. Maintain and enhance in-depth marriage preparation programs.
 - d. Explore more effective and consistent ways to engage young adults in the life of the parish and the diocese.
- 10. Evangelization:
 - a. Provide Evangelization support with outreach to both inactive Catholics and evangelization of current members.
 - b. Use media strategically for Evangelization efforts radio, print media, TV, technology platforms, etc.
 - c. Support Evangelization through education especially around issues of annulment/divorce support.
 - d. Promote the Journey Experience as an Evangelization option.
- 11. Promote diocesan and parish resource sharing:
 - a. Explore practical ways to share personnel, facilities, expertise and education.
 - b. Look at parish models that encourage collaboration.
- 12. Explore and share programs and resources designed to support aging members.
- 13. Support Social Justice outreach:
 - a. Provide leadership, coordination and support for Social Justice outreach on parish and diocesan level.
 - b. Increase visibility and engagement in available Catholic outreach programs (National programs, Diocesan Mission in Guatemala, Catholic Social services, local social outreach programs).
 - c. Support study/implementation of Pope Francis' encyclicals, especially "Joy of the Gospel" and his encyclical on the environment, "Laudato Si"
 - d. Diversity training.
- 14. Facilitate sharing of Financial Information/Communication
 - a. Share fundraising support through help with grant writing, parish capital plans.
 - b. Continue dialogue/communication regarding the long-term plan for restoration of the Parish Deposits through the D& L Restoration Trust.
 - c. Give direction and support regarding facility maintenance, renovation, accessibility and new construction.
 - d. Continue and expand opportunities for Diocesan financial transparency.
- 15. Increase Diocesan visibility in parishes/deaneries:
 - a. Study budget possibilities of increasing diocesan staffing to provide additional programs designed for parish based enrichment/education/training.
