THE PASTORALS ON SUNDAY

A week-by-week resource from the Pastoral Letters of the Bishops' of Rome, of the Second Vatican Council, and of the Bishops' Conference of the United States.

CHRIST THE KING

Ezekiel 34:11-12, 15-17 1 Corinthians 15:20-26, 28 Matthew 25:31-46

I will look after and tend my sheep.

Christ must reign until God has put all enemies under his feet. As often as you did it for one of these least, you did it for me.

In all the issues that affect the well-being of humanity and of this planet, we have often conducted ourselves as if our decisions and actions made no difference. Jesus' scenario is quite different.

Near the end of his life, Jesus offers a vivid picture of the last judgment (Matthew 25:31-46). All the nations of the world will be assembled and will be divided into those blessed who are welcomed into God's kingdom or those cursed who are sent to eternal punishment. The blessed are those who fed the hungry, gave drink to the thirsty, welcomed the stranger, clothed the naked, and visited the sick and imprisoned; the cursed are those who neglected these works of mercy and love. Neither the blessed nor the cursed are astounded that they are judged by the Son of Man, nor that judgment is rendered according to works of charity. The shock comes when they find that in neglecting the poor, the outcast, and the oppressed, they were rejecting Jesus himself.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

In today's Gospel, Jesus delivers the parable of the talents; using the example of money rather than abilities or skills. It's a story about investments, risks and returns. Stewards understand that God has given them an abundance of spiritual gifts. They know God doesn't want them to simply receive these blessings and bury them in fear, but to multiply them; to use these gifts to serve Him and others; to spread Christ's Good News; to go and make disciples of others. Good stewards invest what God has given them in the service of others and are prepared to render an account when the Lord returns. Reflect this week on how you are returning your own God-given gifts back to God with increase.



Dear Friends,

As we approach the end of the Church's year, the seasons of Advent-Christmas-Epiphany and the approaching conclusion of the calendar year provide us with a wonderful opportunity for a special gift to the Diocese of Helena Mission in Guatemala. As people who are blessed by God, this is an important way to give thanks and to bring the face of Christ to some of the "poorest of the poor" in Guatemala.

We are fortunate to be able to count on 6% of the proceeds of the Annual Catholic Appeal to assist funding the Mission efforts. The Mission also benefits from income from Endowments established to support the Mission. But each year more than \$100,000 in continuing support from generous sponsors is required to allow those at the Mission to better respond to the increasing needs of people who find themselves at the edge of poverty.

Sheila McShane reports that the public medical clinics in the area require payment for services, which means that more and more of the patients seeking care at Clinica Maxeña are people who cannot afford the public clinic fees and look to the mission clinic for assistance. Clinica Maxeña also is called upon to transport patients who need specialized care to a hospital in the City and to assist family members who accompany them.

Your donation enables the Clinica Maxeña to assist the many desperately poor people who line up in front of the clinic door each day. The need is great and if the Clinic is to maintain the current level of services, it will require about \$7,000 each month, in addition to the \$7,000 provided through ACA and the Guatemala Endowment.

Santiago de la Asunción School participates in a program which secures government funding to cover teacher salaries. However, such services as facilities maintenance, library, administration, and the boarding-student (internado) program, which allows students who cannot commute daily to sleep, eat, and recreate at the School complex, continue to require our financial support. The ACA and the Guatemala Endowment contribute \$3,000 per month; beginning in January of 2018, we will need about \$5,000 each month in donations to meet these obligations at the school.



In order to maintain current programs at the Mission, about \$10,000 is needed each month. We are confident that generous donors, both long-term and new, will assist us serve the needs of people who are on the edge of poverty and who turn to Clinica Maxeña for medical attention and to Santiago de la Asunción School to provide for their education.
