
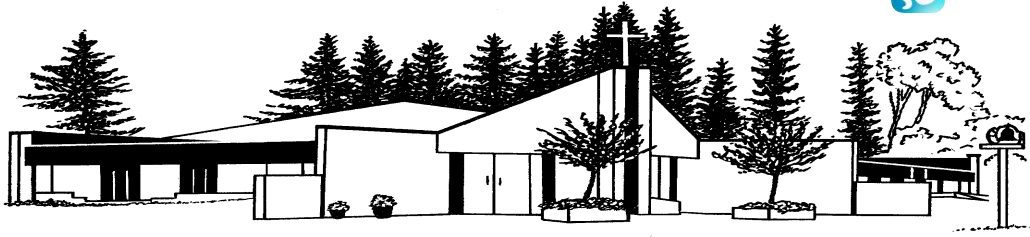

### **RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)**

1. Are you interested in learning about the Catholic Church?
2. Are you an un-baptized person?
3. Are you a baptized person of another faith denomination?

RCIA may be the place for you. This is a learning and loving process in which conversion of the heart brings you to Jesus Christ whom God has sent for the salvation of all. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi, where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and you will see'" (John 1:38-39). The Rite of Christian Initiation is suited to a spiritual journey of adults and consists of four continuous periods.

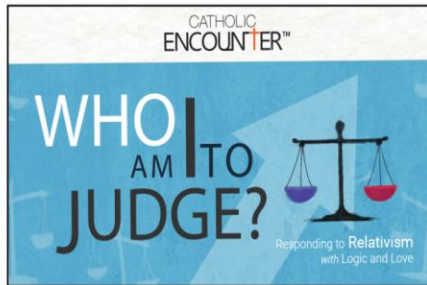
# Who Am I to Judge?
