

The purpose of this training is to bring awareness to our midst about appropriate action during an active shooter situation. This training is provided by our local law enforcement agencies and is recommended by our Diocese and our insurance provider, Catholic Mutual. Some Parishes and Catholic Schools in our dioceses have already done it as well as Parishes in our Valley.

Fr. Stan and our Pastoral Council decided it is time for us to go through this training. We invite, especially, our parish staff, Knights of Columbus, Parish and Finance Councils, RE teachers and volunteers, Choir members, Ushers, Lectors, Cantors, Eucharistic Ministers and everyone from our congregation, men and women alike, who want to be prepared for unexpected circumstances during our gatherings.

It is kind of a sad reality that we have to do such training in our church to feel safe when we gather to worship and pray. But these are the times we live in and we have to prepare ourselves as much as we can to create a safe environment for ourselves and those around us and be responsible for each other as a family of faith.

Please consider taking advantage of this opportunity to build up your self confidence and reliance on each other to feel safe every time you come to church.

It is rather difficult to coordinate our law enforcement agencies with the schedule of the parish for this type of training. Please make sure you sign up and are here on **Saturday October 13, 2018 from 8:00 AM- 4:00 PM** to participate in this training opportunity.

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

St. James warns us about accepting the standards of the world and assuming that what is normative in society needs no countercultural challenge. The temptation to hoard riches and make sharp bargains at the expense of the powerless is pervasive because these things are generally done and look respectable enough. Update on Church Kitchen Remodel

Originally we put together plans for the kitchen remodel in March of this year and requested bids for the project. At the end of March, we had one bidder for the project. Per Diocesan requirements we are to have a minimum of three bidders for any project. It is now September and we still only have one bidder. In the past four weeks we have contacted 27 different contractors about bidding on this project. All have said "no, we are too busy." We contacted the Flathead Building Association. They said that the Building Trades are currently in need of almost 500 skilled workers. Best parking advice is to turn East on 8th Street and park along Kalispell Ave (1 block E) of Spokane. The Nazareth Page

A gospel meditation for the home September 30, 2018 – 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

When Jesus wanted to make a point that is quite basic, he often talked about water. Water is necessary for life. Most of our body is water. Most of what we eat and drink is water. We can go for days without food, but we can hardly survive for a day or two without water. Humans over the years have lived near sources of clean water because without water, they would not survive. When Jesus wanted to describe God's gift of eternal life, he spoke of "living waters" which are given to us by God's Spirit. When Jesus died on the cross, the gospels note that blood and water flowed from him. Scripture scholars suggest that this relates to the sacraments of the Eucharist and Baptism. So, whenever water is mentioned in the gospels, it's important to pay attention. Important matters are being presented to us.

Parents all have heard a child's call for a drink of water during the night. While an initial response might be a call to the child to "get it yourself," good parents know that this request for water is not just for a drink, but for the reassurance that comes from the parent's immediate presence during the dark of night. They want water, but even more they want mom or dad. They want their water served with love.

Today's gospel presents a dilemma that faced the disciples of Jesus. They had joined Jesus to be part of his group, his band of disciples who were called upon to assist Jesus in his public ministry. They formed a new "we" and saw themselves as distinct from others who were not in their club.

A question apparently arose when they saw others, groups, not in their circle, who also claimed to be part of Christ's operation. They were doing good things, but according to the disciples, they were "outsiders." Jesus seemed not bothered by this. If they were doing good, let them continue. They are doing what is part of God's intent for all of us. They are serving the needs of those who need their help. So, be careful about judging the good done by others. It's not about who is doing what. It is about what's being done. Goodness and Godness is not restricted to one person or to one group. We are all sisters and brothers in the Lord.

This can be of importance to families that might be divided by group allegiance or religious affiliation. Again, if anyone does good, which may only mean the giving of a drink of water to a little one, let it be. In fact, let that be celebrated and acknowledged as an important part of what God desires from all of us.




