
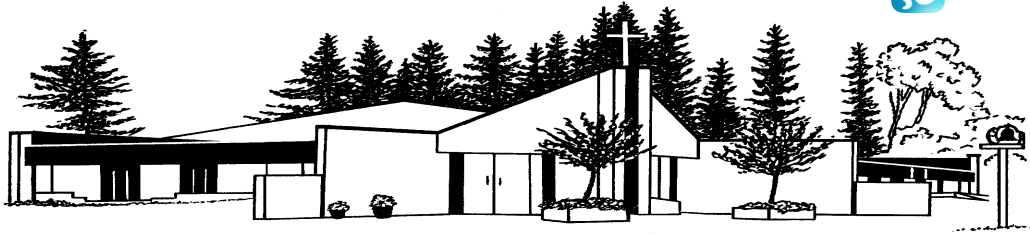

We will have safety training for our church community on **Saturday, October 13, 2018** to create a safe environment for our congregation. The purpose of this training is to bring awareness to our midst about appropriate action during an active shooter situation. This training is provided by our local law enforcement agencies and is recommended by our Diocese and our insurance provider, Catholic Mutual. Some Parishes and Catholic Schools in our dioceses have already done it as well as Parishes in our Valley.

Fr. Stan and our Pastoral Council decided it is time for us to go through this training. We invite, especially, our parish staff, Knights of Columbus, Parish and Finance Councils, RE teachers and volunteers, Choir members, Ushers, Lectors, Cantors, Eucharistic Ministers and everyone from our congregation, men and women alike, who want to be prepared for unexpected circumstances during our gatherings.

It is kind of a sad reality that we have to do such training in our church to feel safe when we gather to worship and pray. But these are the times we live in and we have to prepare ourselves as much as we can to create a safe environment for ourselves and those around us and be responsible for each other as a family of faith.

Please consider taking advantage of this opportunity to build up your self confidence and reliance on each other to feel safe every time you come to church.

It is rather difficult to coordinate our law enforcement agencies with the schedule of the parish for this type of training. Please make sure you sign up and are here on **Saturday October 13, 2018 from 8:00 AM- 4:00 PM** to participate in this training opportunity.

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Wisdom 7:7-11 I preferred wisdom to scepter and throne
Hebrews 4:12-13 God's word is living and effective.
Mark 10:17-30 How can the rich enter the kingdom?

In his claim that riches interfere with salvation Jesus was espousing a radical idea to people who believed riches were a reward for a devout life. In their document on the economy the American bishops challenge our nation to be fearless of the radical ideas necessary to "Launch an experiment" to secure economic rights for every person.

The economic challenge of today has many parallels with the political challenge that confronted the founders of our nation. In order to create a new form of political democracy they were compelled to develop ways of thinking and political institutions that had never existed before. Their efforts were arduous and their goals imperfectly realized, but they launched an experiment in the protection of civil and political rights that has prospered through the efforts of those who came after them. *We believe the time has come for a similar experiment in securing economic rights: the creation of an order that guarantees the minimum conditions of human dignity in the economic sphere for every person.*

We are in need of volunteers from Risen Christ Parish to help with Prayer outside the abortion facility. Hours have changed this year to a 12-hour vigil instead of the 24-hour vigil that has been maintained in the past. The new hours are 7am – 7 pm, seven days per week. While praying, please be sure that you are standing in front of **All Families Healthcare** and not in front of the building on the corner. It is easy to migrate. To simplify, be sure to stand between the wooden arch to the north and the large tree at the south end of the property. Also note that we are permitted to stand in the alley right of way (back entrance to abortion facility). Please do not block/obstruct vehicle or foot traffic. Best parking advice is to turn east on 8th Street and park along Kalispell Ave (1 block E) of Spokane. 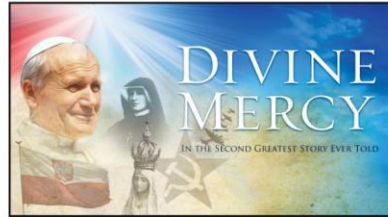
