
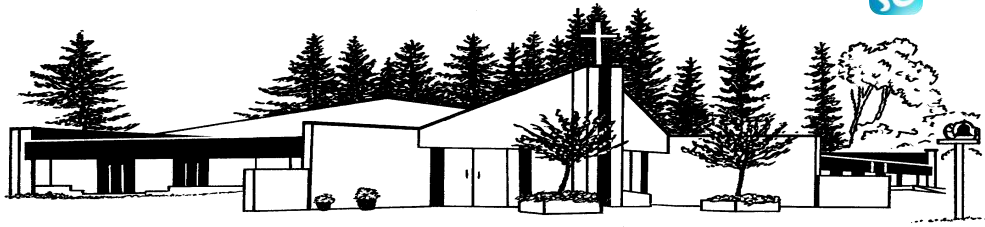

MARRIAGE MATTERS

While this is understandable, if it becomes a habit our spouses will begin to feel unimportant.

- * Intentionally showing physical affection.
- * Praying together.
- * Expressing gratitude to and for your spouse.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

The exchange between Jesus and Pilate in today's Gospel is, arguably, the most important exchange in all of literature. Pilate asks Jesus: "What have you done?" Jesus replies that he testifies to the truth. In the second reading we are reminded of the essence of that truth: Christ, ruler of all, loves us, liberates us from the bonds of sin, makes us into new kingdom. As we approach the Advent season, this week would be a good time to reflect on the question: What have we done in our daily lives, in our actions, words, private prayer, and in our interaction with others, to testify that Jesus is Lord?

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Jeremiah 33:14-16 A just shoot shall do what is right and just in the land.
1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2 May the Lord make you overflow with love for one another.
Luke 21:25-28, 34-36 Be on guard. Pray constantly to stand securely.

As we begin the Advent season, we find we are not unlike the houses of Israel and Judah. We are waiting and watching for a day when peace will reign and justice will prevail—a time when “our ransom” is at hand.

We must pray for and earnestly desire a sense of urgency regarding our missionary task. This sense of urgency flows from the demands of being faithful disciples of Jesus, from our responsibility to share his gospel and from a concern that all our brothers and sisters participate as fully as possible in his life and saving mystery. We see this urgency in the life of Jesus, God's beloved Son, who was sent to proclaim the good news of the kingdom: “This is the time of fulfillment; the reign of God is at hand! Reform your lives and believe in the gospel!” (Mark 1:15)

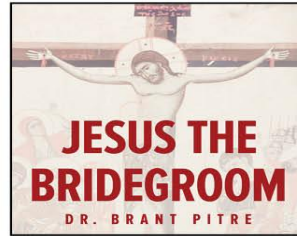
