

YOU ARE INVITED TO FULLY AND ACTIVELY PARTICIPATE IN THE HOLY THURSDAY FOOT WASHING, April 18, 2019

Except for the Resurrection on Easter, Holy Thursday is possibly one of the most important, complex, and profound days of celebration in the Catholic Church. Holy Thursday celebrates the institution of the Eucharist as the true body and blood of Jesus Christ and the institution of the sacrament of priesthood.

Jesus establishes the special priesthood for his disciples, which is distinct from the "priesthood of all believers." Christ washed the feet of his disciples, who would become the first priests. The Eucharist and the priesthood are inseparable. Priests are servants of the Eucharist and servants of the people. The servitude of the priestly ministry to the people is symbolized in the foot washing celebration that we have imitated since the Last Supper.

Eucharist means being a servant of the reign of God; "the full meaning of tonight's celebration hinges on the foot washing....This gesture of humility and service expresses the responsibilities of those

Throughout history, both ancient and contemporary communities have reenacted this command of Jesus. This year, to respect fully this symbol, each parishioner, young and old, is encouraged to take a full and active part in being washed. This is not a popular activity: not even Peter wanted to have his feet washed. But you are asked to prayerfully consider being a part of this ritual.

Charity, Unity, Fraternity & Patriotism



The Nazareth Page

A gospel meditation for your home
April 14, 2019 – Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord
Luke 22:14-23:1-49

The gospels were gradually written based on oral traditions and memories of those who were witnesses to the life and death of Jesus. They recalled his words and deeds. Those who study how the gospels were written agree that the account of the passion and death of Jesus was probably the first part of the gospel to be put into writing.

That's because the death and resurrection of Jesus are the central moments of the life of Jesus. In recalling these events, we are reminded that death is not the final moment of the life of Jesus and our lives. Rather, death is our entrance into eternal life with God. It is a gift from God. We were created not just to live and die, but to live again. That is God's plan. Each year, as we celebrate Holy Week, we are reminded of this amazing truth.

When we hear the passion read each year on Palm Sunday and during Holy Week, we might pay special attention to a few key points. First, Jesus willingly underwent his terribly painful death because he wanted to. He desired to show how much he loved us. He consciously faced the evils of his time, especially that which existed in power-hungry religious and political leaders. Both expressions of power were responsible for his death.

He suffered the death of a common criminal who was not a Roman citizen. His death is described in the gospel in careful detail. It is the only account of a full day in the life of Jesus. All the details are meaningful and can be a source of prayer and meditation for us.

He entered Jerusalem to shouts of "Hosanna," which is what was commonly said during the arrival of significant persons. He shared a Passover meal with his closest followers during which he first washed their feet (a sign of gracious hospitality and service) and then shared his body and blood (which meant his whole being) with them. He then deliberately walked to his execution. He experienced terrible torture before he was led to the hill on which he was crucified. At that time crucifixion was the most painful and humiliating death possible. And as we now say, he did this "for us and for our salvation." No greater love has even been expressed. Again, we say that "he loved us to the end."

Earlier during his life, he said that we are to take up our cross daily and follow him. Doing so contributes mightily to our sanctification and that of the whole world. Central to our faith is a belief that we are created by God and destined to share life with God forever. And our path to that life follows the steps taken by Jesus. This week we are reminded of how steep some of those steps are.

Statement from St. Richard Parish

We Need You at Lake McDonald This Summer!

As many of you may know, our parish of St. Richard is charged with the West Glacier/Apgar/Lake McDonald mission, which in part means we are responsible for bringing the word and body of Christ to the residents and visitors of those areas during the summer months. You may also know that recent Glacier National Park policy changes and renovation to the park headquarters Community Center building has precluded Saturday masses at Apgar and headquarters this summer.

Through the cooperation of park officials and Xanterra Corporation (concessionaire for Lake McDonald Lodge), *this* summer we have obtained permission to use the community building at Lake McDonald Lodge for weekly liturgy. Due to scheduling conflicts, we will not be able to provide mass in the park this year; however, **we will be offering communion service at the lodge on Saturdays** – a practice our parish conducted back in the '80s and '90s.

In order to provide this important ministry, we are beginning preparation now, starting with recruitment of St. Richard members to serve as **lay liturgy leaders** (Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion – "EMHC") for these Saturday communion services. The EMHC will take on the duties of setting up for the service, leading the service, and ensuring that the facility is put back in its original state.

The dates for these summer communion services are June 1, 8, 15, 22, and 29; July 6, 13, 20 and 27; and August 3, 10, 17, 24 and 31. Volunteers may sign up for one or more dates. It's our goal that a good number of our parish family will pitch in so this doesn't fall on the shoulders of only a few.

Deacon Doug will be included in the schedule – and will also provide 2 training sessions – **Tuesday, April 30 and Tuesday, May 7 at 6 p.m. in the Pearce Center** – prior to the beginning of the service season to fully prepare the EMHC so they will go forth to serve with confidence and clear purpose! Each volunteer will be given a copy of the communion service liturgy guide. Training sessions will focus on the structure of the service and actual practice with fellow EMHC.

Absolutely **no** experience is necessary – only requirements are having been confirmed and possess an open heart for service. Our parish family who conducted these services in the past expressed how enjoyable and rewarding they were – interacting with and offering the word and body of Christ to visitors from around the world was a unique, grace-filled experience!
