READINGS FOR THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME October 27, 2019:

Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18The Lord is a God of justice.2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18;I have fought the good fight.Luke 18:9-14I give you thanks, O God, that I am not like the rest.

Authentic love of our church, our country, our communities, parishes, jobs even our own selves, requires honest examination in light of Christian principles set forth in scripture and tradition. We must not be afraid to confront our "warts" if we are to build a reign of God.

The Synod of Bishops in 1971 worded this challenge [for economic justice in the Church] most aptly: "While the Church is bound to give witness to justice, she recognizes that anyone who ventures to speak to people about justice must first be just in their eyes. Hence, we must undertake an examination of the modes of acting and of the possessions and lifestyle found within the Church herself."

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home October 20, 2019 – 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 18:1-8

Today's gospel touches on that quality in God that is God's justice. Spiritual writers (including myself) often focus on God's love for all. We know in faith that this is a consistent message in the Bible. This aspect of the divine person culminates in John the evangelist simply writing, *God is love*. But, we ask, is God not also just? I have to say here that when I was much younger, the idea of God's justice was consistently brought before me. Especially when I did something that I knew was wrong.

Not to doubt this aspect of our faith, but there's another side of God's justice that is also quite important, God's rewarding of the good we do. I recently read a wonderful theological reflection on what we might expect after we die. Written by a distinguished scripture scholar, Gerhard Lofink, called *Is This All There Is? On Resurrection and Eternal Life*. I rarely endorse another publication in these pages, but this I do. It's brilliant!

Based on God's deep sense of justice, he suggests that everything that is *good* that we accomplish here on Earth in this life becomes part of what constitutes our eternal life with God. God saves it all, preserves it all and adds it to our forever life with God. Obviously, none of us know the details of that life, but his point is that in justice, God takes into reality, into God's kingdom, all the good we do, however great or small that might be. Nothing is lost.

In Matthew's gospel we read, "And whoever gives a cup of water to one of these little ones to drink ... he will surely not lose his reward." (Mt. 10:42) This is one of my favorite passages in the gospels. Note that Jesus does not say that this simple gesture of service is done for a reward. No, it is simply done. It is a good thing to do. Children need water to survive. And parents provide this and so much more!

This insight into God's justice can be a meaningful part of our daily life as Disciples of Christ. Sometimes, we limit our sense of "doing good" to religious acts, church-related activities or acts having strong moral implications. But here I am noting that while all that is important, in fact, everything we do that is good – a simple gesture of kindness or consideration – is very significant to God and to the future of all of us. God's justice demands that and creates that reality.
