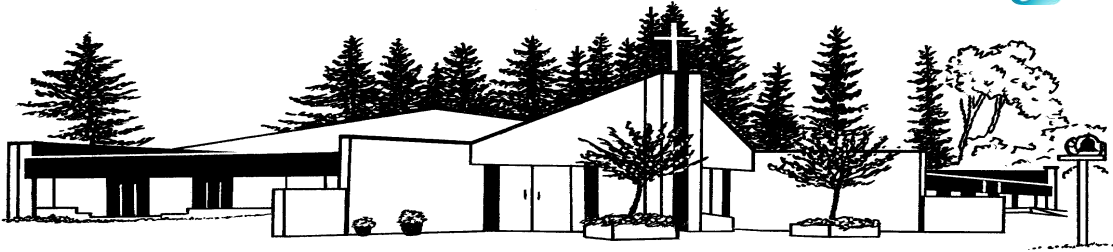

A gospel meditation for your home
June 28, 2020 – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Matthew 10:37-42

Today's gospel is complicated and one that I think is easily misunderstood. Some might think it is anti-family because it seems to say that our love for God (and Jesus) is in competition with our love of family. Or even that love of family is not important.

I write these gospel reflections to help readers appreciate the importance of interpersonal life, especially as it exists in marriage, family life and friendship. I want to place those important relationships in the context of a vital Christian life. I try to show the importance of connecting our love of God with our love of neighbor.

In one of John's epistles it states that if you claim that you love God, but don't love your neighbor, you are a liar. I take that as one of the most important truths of our faith. Further, at the Last Supper Jesus stated that we are to love one another as he loves us. Neighbor love is placed at the heart of our lives as followers of Jesus.

Based on this gospel (and other teachings of the church) we learn that there is to be a certain priority of values in our life. Because we are created by God, loved by God and will be with God forever (our deepest hope), God should be first in our lives. Not because God needs us, but rather because we need God.

All our personal life ultimately comes from God. Thus, God should be our first and primary consideration. Once we do that, all else in our lives can be placed in proper order. All the other parts of our life, all that we love here on earth, can be expressions of our love for God.

Because we are loved by God and love God before all else (the First Commandment) we can love very fully all that God has created. That even includes loving ourselves. But also, those with whom we share life during our earthly lives. Because so much of that life is rooted in family relationships, family relationships play an important role in our life with God. So too do friendships, relationships with neighbors, co-workers, even strangers. In that sense, every other person on earth with us are our neighbors.

In recent months, because of the perils associated with Covid-19 and the many issues related to racial injustice, we are reminded that we are all neighbors to each other and that we have responsibilities for each other. Out of our love for God, we love all others too.

Dear Risen Christ Community,

I am very blessed to be able to share with you, my childhood parish, about a very exciting ministry work I will be starting in September. I have been accepted to serve as a missionary with NET Ministries Ireland for a year! NET stands for National Evangelization Team and is a Catholic organization that travels around Ireland facilitating retreats in parishes and schools and shares with others about what it means to follow Christ. Our mission is to encourage young people to love Jesus and embrace the life of the Church, challenging them to step-up and be leaders of truth and hope in a world where many people are struggling to find any meaning at all. Young people today are becoming complacent, and many young Catholics are leaving the Catholic Church to go to other churches or they're just leaving the church and religion behind altogether. But now, more than ever, they need to hear the Good News of the Gospels, especially in Ireland where "no-religion" is the fastest growing religion. Young people need to hear it from their Church and they need to see its reality experienced and lived out in the lives of their peers.

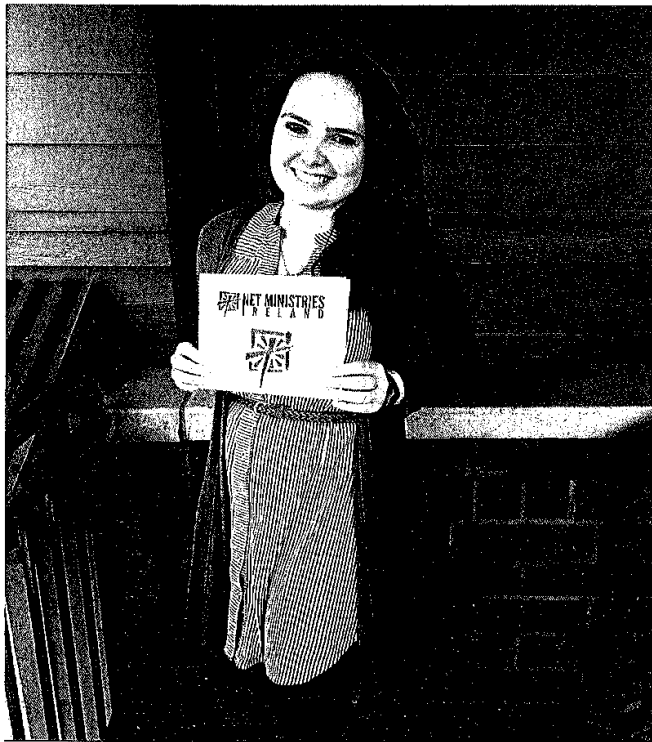
I first started thinking about NET during my junior year of college. I knew that I wanted to take some time after I graduated for ministry work, but I wasn't quite sure exactly what type of ministry that was. But, thankfully, God did! One day while my friend and I were grabbing coffee, she mentioned NET Ministries to me, and I decided to research them. After looking into NET, I knew that evangelization through this ministry program was a path that God wanted me to pursue. God constantly gave me the little signs in my life that I asked to show that NET was His Will for me, especially through the Mass readings. So, after a year of prayerful discernment, I applied to NET in January, and they contacted me the next month telling me I was accepted! I am thankful for the call God has placed on my heart, humbled by how faithful He has been through it all, grateful for the grace to be able to say "yes" to the call, and really looking forward to what God will do in this year on mission.

In *Evangelii Nuntiandi*, Pope Paul VI said "Evangelizing is in fact the grace and vocation proper to the Church, her deepest identity. She exists in order to evangelize." We are all called to evangelize. I know not everyone can "give by going," but we all can "go by giving." I am asking that you help support me in this call that we've been given. As a part of my time on NET, I am asked to raise a minimum of €7,000 or about \$8000. This will cover a portion of the cost of training, accommodations, food and transportation while I'm in Ireland. All donations are appreciated and they can even be made in monthly increments for your convenience. I ask you to prayerfully consider helping me and join this mission. In return, as a NET missionary, my commitment to you is that I will pray for you, work at least 40 hours a week, give 100% to the mission and vision of NET, and stay in contact with you via monthly update letters from me throughout the year.

Please prayerfully consider the amount you may be able to support me in this ministry.
