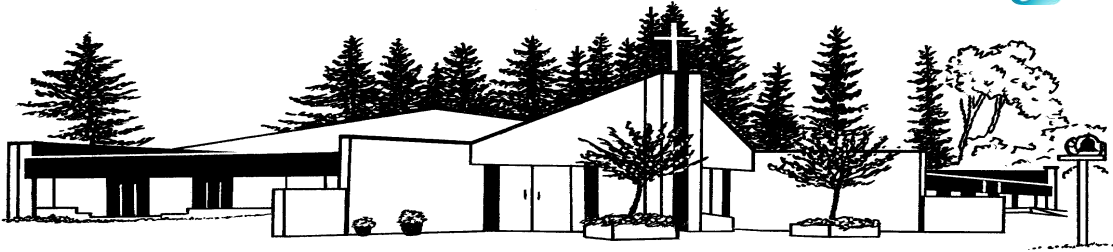

READINGS FOR THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

June 14, 2020

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a -- 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 -- John 6:51-58

~ QUESTION OF THE WEEK ~

“At Mass, how is the bread and wine God’s Body and Blood? When I see the bread, I don’t see flesh or skin. Also, the wine is not thick enough to be blood.”

You are right that in the Eucharist we do not see the flesh and blood of Christ in their natural forms. That’s because the Eucharist is a *sacrament*, which means it is a *sign* (1 Cor 11:26; CCC 1130-31). The sign can be discerned (seen, heard, felt, tasted, or touched) but not Christ’s actual flesh. So we have to have faith in the invisible reality (Jn 20:29).

For example, you cannot see your sins being forgiven in baptism. All you see is water being poured on you (and all you feel is wet). Yet we really and truly have our sins removed with baptism (Acts 2:38, 22:16; CCC 265). We can discern (feel) the water. We have to have faith that the forgiveness of sins actually took place.

In the case of the Eucharist, all we see are the appearances of bread and wine. The invisible reality is Christ’s glorified Body and Blood, His soul and divinity (Lk 22:19-20; Mt 26:26-28; CCC 1413).

Things we encounter have *substance* and *accidents*. *Substance* refers to the thing itself that exists *in itself* rather than as an *aspect* of something else. A tree, a car, and a human being are “substances” in this sense. But these things also have certain qualities or characteristics that do not exist on their own but *in* them.

Think of it this way: A tree may have green leaves or brown. A car may be red or green. A human may be tall or short. These characteristics are real, but they don’t exist on their own; they exist as attributes of *other* things. We never, for instance, run into “redness” or “tallness.” These qualities exist, but only in things that are red or tall--that car or that boy. We call such qualities the *accidents* (in technical language, not in the ordinary sense of the word, that is, something unintended).

The Eucharist has both substance and accidents. When the priest consecrates the Eucharist, the accidents of bread and wine remain while their substance is changed into the Body and Blood of Christ. The Eucharist looks like bread and wine and tastes like bread and wine, but has really and truly changed into the Body and Blood of Christ (1 Cor 10:16, 11:23-25; CCC 1375).

Ordinarily a change of substance would mean a change in accidents, for the accidents of a thing usually go along with the substance. But in the Eucharist God supernaturally maintains the accidents of bread and wine (the color, shape, taste, smell, etc.) despite changing their substance to that of the Body and Blood of Christ (CCC 1374).

Why does God retain the accidents of bread and wine? For at least five reasons:

1. God reminds us that Christ is the source of our spiritual as well as physical life by using the appearance of bread and wine, which help give us physical life (Jn 6:55-58). God often links the physical and spiritual together.

2. God becomes one with us physically as we eat the Eucharistic elements. This communion is a means of joining with us spiritually (Jn 6:56; 1Cor 10:16; CCC 1416). Jesus literally takes on the accidents normal to bread and wine, while keeping his divine/human substance. He does this with the accidents of bread and wine, which are taken into our bodies to become part of us.
3. God links the Eucharist to His covenant with the Jewish people. The elements of bread and wine are taken from the Passover meal of the Hebrews (Lk 22:15; CCC 1409).
4. God wants to link the Eucharist with every meal. When food is blessed, we acknowledge God as Lord of our lives and of creation. The Eucharist is the supreme act of acknowledgment (1 Cor 11:26), for in it we offer God's supreme gift to us, Jesus, back to Him. And with the Eucharist, we also offer ourselves to God.
5. As St. Augustine says, the Eucharist, in keeping the appearance of bread and wine, reminds us that "from many grains we are made one loaf; from many grapes, one vintage" (Sermon 227.1). Matthew J Pinto, Did Adam & Eve Have Belly Buttons

RESOURCES FOR AGING ADULTS

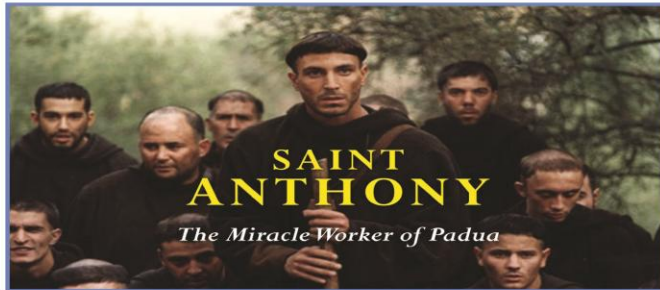
