# READINGS FOR THE TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME August 30, 2020

Jeremiah 20:7-9 Romans 12:1-2 Matthew 16:21-27

## PRACTICE OF HOPE

Like Jeremiah in today's First Reading, or Peter in today's Gospel, we sometimes resist God's call and turn away from the full realization of the path of discipleship. To deny oneself, take up the cross, and follow Christ is not an easy path. And yet, as the psalmist prays, our souls thirst for God, who has planted this call deep within us and in whose service we find fullness of life.

\*We follow Christ by taking up the cross each day in lives of service. Offer to Christ the daily sacrifices you make for others.

\*Consider Christ's call to take up the cross as you read Pope Francis' words in *The Joy of the Gospel*: "Jesus wants us to touch human misery, to touch the suffering flesh of others. He hopes that we will...enter into the reality of other people's lives and know the power of tenderness."

\*Ask God to strengthen your resolve to follow Christ as his disciple. Consider joining your prayer with St. Francis of Assisi, who prayed: "Most High, glorious God, enlighten the darkness of my heart and give me true faith, certain hope, and perfect charity, sense and knowledge, Lord, that I may carry out your holy and true command. Amen."

# SAINT JOSEPH CALASANZ - FEAST DAY AUGUST 25

This Spaniard studied law at the University of Lerida and was ordained a priest in 1583, despite his father's hope that he would be a soldier. He became vicar general of a Spanish diocese, but in 1592 left for Rome, where he joined the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine and worked with neglected children. In 1597 he established the first free school in Rome with three other priests. This work led him to found the Clerks Regular of the Religious (or Pious) Schools, known as Piarists. He overcame internal and external opposition and served as superior general of the order. He was canonized in 1767, and in 1948 Pope Pius XII named him the patron saint of Christian schools. He is also a patron of students.



# The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home August 23, 2020 – Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 16:13-20

Many of us enjoy a good mystery story. We delight in books, movies and television shows where we are brought into a story where, for most of the narration, we are "left in the dark" about "who done it" or "what's really going on." We pay close attention because there are usually "clues" about the "what and the who." Good stories always seem to have well-placed clues. Some are subtle and some are more obvious. We hope we don't miss them.

Biblical scholars often point to today's' gospel as one of those places where we are given clarity (a good clue) as to what's really going on in the life of Jesus. While the event described is brief, it is packed with important information about Jesus. Through the words of Peter, we catch a glimpse of the deeper identity of Jesus and the mission of Jesus here on earth.

Some explanation might help us more fully appreciate the importance of this gospel narrative. Jesus asks his disciples what others are saying about Jesus. Who is he? Where does he come from? What is he doing? Key questions for sure.

As good Jews, those who know Jesus, his deeds and his words, have various opinions of who he might be. Perhaps he is a prophet like those sent from God in their history. Knowing that John the Baptist (someone people saw as doing God's work on earth) had been killed by Herod, some wondered whether Jesus might be connected to him. So, lots of opinions about Jesus out there.

Then Jesus looks at Peter and asks him directly what he thinks. What's recorded in Mark's Gospel are the very telling words: "Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God." We are also told that the work of Jesus is bringing together heaven and earth. In other words, God with humankind. What's done on earth happens also in heaven, and what's in heaven in a real way happens also on earth. What's beginning with the coming of Jesus is what's prayed for in the Our Father: "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." Jesus came to earth to unite God with creation. God with us. In fact, Jesus is God with us.

This is the deepest mystery of all. We are given a clue, but it will take us a whole lifetime (and more) to appreciate the fullness of this. As was presented in a book and movie a few years back, this is "The Greatest Story ever told."
