MESSAGE FROM FATHER STAN

We at Risen Christ will be having five Masses for Christmas this year. There will be three on Christmas Vigil and two on Christmas Day. We would like to encourage every parishioner of Risen Christ to consider attending one of the Christmas services. Please see times listed as follows:

Christmas Eve - 4:30 pm, 7:00 pm and 11:00 pm.

Christmas Day - 9:30 am & 11:30 am

The general idea for Mass attendance is: for less vulnerable people (young families with children) to attend the 4:30 pm Vigil Mass or 11:30 am Christmas Day Mass. For more vulnerable people (older people with pre-existing conditions) we suggest attending the 7:00 pm Vigil Mass or 11:00 pm or 9:30 am Christmas Day Mass.

As you know dispensation is granted during this time of Covid; however, Risen Christ will make sure if you decide to come you will be able to attend safely, wearing masks and keeping social distancing. The church will be sanitized after every service to give you even more confidence. As far as we know as of December 3rd, nobody has been infected with Covid from attending Mass, Religious Education, Bible study or Knights of Columbus meetings at Risen Christ.

Even though you are not obligated to attend, remember CHRISTMAS is about welcoming Christ into your heart and your soul. The best way to do so is to receive communion on Christmas day.

How are you made different by the presence of God in your heart? Name one way your worldview is different because of your faith. What one thing could you do to manifest that difference? Epiphany Blessing "Chalking the Door 2021"

Each year around the feast of the Epiphany, many parishes participate in an annual blessing of chalk throughout the world. It is an ancient tradition that not only places God at the entrance of your home; it puts your entire family under his protection.

The Epiphany blessing of chalk and homes is a centuries-old tradition where priests visit each family in their parish after the Feast of Epiphany. Over time it became more difficult for priests to see all the homes of his parish. Thus, it became an accepted tradition that a member of the household can lead this blessing instead of the priest.

Using the Blessed Chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or porch step as follows):

20 + C + M + B + 21 *while saying:*

The three Wise Men, Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar, followed God's Son's star, who became human two thousand and twenty years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen

Then offer the following prayer:

Visit, O Blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; grant that we may manifest our love to each other and all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and in the knowledge and love of you; guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.

Chalking the door is a way to celebrate and mark the occasion of the Epiphany and God's blessing of our lives and our home. With time the chalk will fade. As it does, we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our hearts and be manifest in our words and actions.
