READINGS FOR PENTECOST SUNDAY MAY 23, 2021

Acts 2:1-11

Galatians 5:16-25

John 15:26-27; 16:12-15

The birthday of the Church is something to celebrate, especially in a secular world desperate for more believers of Jesus to become a bolder presence. In the reading from Acts, we hear of God's Spirit filling the believers with the power to speak different languages. Devout Jews from many regions who were in Jerusalem at the time were amazed that they could understand this group that had gathered. We too can allow ourselves to be filled with God's Spirit so that our daily actions flow with divine messages. ◆Experiment with some translation apps to explore how your voice – your message of hope – can be relayed to non-English-speaking friends in other countries. ◆Reflect on Pope Francis' statement in *Amoris laetitia* "the church is a family of families, constantly enriched by the lives of all those domestic churches" (87). Consider how the practice of faith in your home can enrich the church.

Born near Spoleto, Italy, Rita wanted to be a nun but married in deference to her parents. For nearly 20 years, she endured her profligate husband's mistreatment. Following his violent death, she was admitted after three refusals to an Augustinian convent at Cascia, where she spent the next 40 years. She is remembered for her devoted care of sick nuns and for a deep forehead wound that lasted 15 years, caused she said by a thorn from Christ's crown of thorns. She has a large popular following, and is invoked in Italy for difficult situations.



The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home May 16, 2021 – The Ascension of the Lord Mark 16:15-20

I have a grandson who is a high school athlete, a runner. One of his specialties is the relay races where four young speedsters encircle the track in sequence, passing what's called a baton to the one whose turn it is to next run for the team.

Two special skills are needed for success. Speed afoot and facility in passing the baton from one runner to the next. Good teams practice both aspects of the race. Failure in either area inevitably results in losing the race.

In a sense, today's gospel for the feast celebrating the Ascension of Jesus from earth to heaven, can be thought of as like a relay race. Jesus has completed his part of the race (figuratively speaking) and he is passing a "baton" to us to do the next part. As we do, we are told both the direction to take, and what to do while running. Recall what Mark's gospel for today states: "Go into the whole world (the direction to run) and proclaim the gospel to every creature (the task)."

For two-thousand years members of "Team Jesus" have been circling the world, baton in hand. As St. Paul wrote, "Running the good race."

When I read this challenge from Jesus in my earlier days, I concluded that I was being called to be a foreign missionary in Africa. "Going into the whole world" meant for me leaving the country in which I was born and going to a distant place. I never embarked for that world. Instead my mission was to remain in the country where I was born.

I now have the baton in hand – as do you. I won't comment on how fast I am now running (not very) but I'm still in the race. Since I never went to the foreign missions, my "assigned" world became more local, with a large part of that world being my family. Beside that setting I run "the race" in my neighborhood, in my career as an educator, a theologian and a writer.

Each of us is given a part of the world to enter and make our run. And in that world, we are not only invited to proclaim the gospel, but even more importantly, to embody its meaning in our actions each day. In that sense, according to Pope Francis, we are all missionaries – meaning those sent by God to continue the work of Jesus. We now carry the baton for the God team in the place where we awoke this morning.

Sacred Relics of The Saints: Treasures of The Church St. Richard Parish presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on Wednesday May 26 at 6:00 pm. Father Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will be here with an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. Among the treasures will be relics of St. Joseph, St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux (the "Little Flower"), St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas, and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be a portion of the Veil of Our Lady and one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. Those in attendance will be able to examine and venerate each relic. Throughout history, many healings have been worked in the presence of relics; and many have been come about through this ministry. Do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the religuaries as a means of intercession.

APOSTOLIC PENITENTIARY

Prot. N. 227/18/I

DECREE

For increasing the religious observance of the faithful and for the salvation of souls, the APOSTOLIC PENITENTIARY, by the power of the faculties granted to it by the Supreme Pontiff, Francis, Pope by Divine Providence, following the petitions brought forth on the 12th of February, 2018, by Reverend Carlos Martins, CC, Coordinator of the Pilgrimages of Relics, to be carried out throughout the United States of America, benevolently grants a plenary indulgence under the customary conditions (Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion, and prayer according to the mind of the Supreme Pontiff) to be obtained by all faithful Christians truly penitent, if they are present at the sacred pilgrimage of the relics, which, with a great concourse of the people, will be carried out through very many dioceses of the United States of America.

Thus, the pilgrims will be encouraged to transfer the supernatural virtues into the action of their lives, especially Faith, Hope, and Charity, and they will solidify their union with the Roman Pontiff, the visible foundation of the unity of the whole Catholic Church.

Persons of old age, the sick, and all who are unable to leave their home for a serious reason, will likewise be able to gain the plenary indulgence after their rejection of every sin that has been conceived in their hearts, and with the intention of fulfilling, as soon as it would be have been possible, the three customary conditions, if they would have joined themselves spiritually to the holy pilgrimages, and after prayers and their own sufferings and inconveniences have been offered to a merciful God.

Therefore, in order that, in keeping with pastoral love, the access may be made easier to attain divine forgiveness through the Keys of the Church, this Apostolic Penitentiary earnestly begs that pastors and priests endowed with the opportune faculties of hearing Confessions may offer themselves with a ready and generous spirit for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance. The present document will have validity for seven years, notwithstanding anything whatsoever to the contrary. Given in Rome, from the building of the Apostolic Penitentiary, on the 23rd day of March in the year of the Lord's Incarnation 2018.
