

TEACHABLE MOMENT

The Church teaches that there are seven “gifts” of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, and fear of the Lord. These gifts are spelled out in Isaiah 11:1-3 as characteristics of the spirit of the Lord that will rest upon the Messiah. They are an explicit part of the prayer that is said when the minister of the sacrament of confirmation extends his hands prior to anointing the believer.



A gospel meditation for your home
June 5th, 2022 – Pentecost Sunday
John 20:19-23*

We live in a world that is saturated with fear. A terrible war continues in the friendly country of Ukraine. The unconscionable killing of innocent children in Uvalde, Texas fills our news cycle. Thus, we cannot claim peace at home or abroad. And these events, and countless more, create fertile ground for increasing fear in all of us.

The gospel for this Pentecost Sunday can help us deal with this. Fear is not what God wants. God is a God of peacefulness, not fear. And the challenge of our being at peace is therefore up to us.

Recall the situation experienced by the disciples of Jesus after his death. They had just witnessed the horror of the arrest, torture and death of their beloved Jesus. He deserved none of what he experienced. They mourned his loss, but also considered their own fate. They were filled with fear because, to use a current phrase, they might be next. So, they needed God's help to transport them from fear and anguish to peace of mind and heart. Otherwise, they could not undertake what Jesus expected of them. Something that involved courage!

And that's what was given to them with God remaining in them and with them. God's empowering presence would accompany them for the rest of the days ahead. No matter what. And not only them, but also us as we continue to live the life given us by God. Like them, we never have to face life's challenges alone. God is deeply with us and for us.

Fear can have terrible power over us, destroying any enthusiasm for living that we deserve as children of a loving God. Fear can limit the joy we should have in daily life. It turns us into ourselves, causing us to be defensive and worrisome over even imaginary dangers. It limits the generosity we should have towards ourselves and others.

There is no doubt that our lives bring us up against all kinds of challenges. The world is a dangerous place. But as recent tragedies remind us, we need to stay strong. And hopeful that our efforts can be successful in making the world a better place (although not a perfect place), one moment at a time, one situation at a time, one day at a time.

And God is there on our side. On the side of hope. On the side of goodness. No matter what. Welcome the Spirit of God into your life. We all need that presence.
