

TEACHABLE MOMENT

The mystery of the Holy Trinity is the central mystery of the Christian faith and life. God reveals himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. The doctrine of the Trinity includes three truths of faith.

First, the Trinity is One. We do not speak of three gods but of one God. Each of the Persons is fully God. They are a unity of Persons in one divine nature.

Second, the Divine Persons are distinct from each other. Father, Son, and Spirit are not three appearances or modes of God, but three identifiable persons, each fully God in a way distinct from the others.

Third, the Divine Persons are in relation to each other. The distinction of each is understood only in reference to the others. The Father cannot be the Father without the Son, nor can the Son be the Son without the Father. The Holy Spirit is related to the Father and the Son who both send him forth.

All Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Trinity illumines all the other mysteries of faith.

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA, Feast day June 13

Anthony of Padua, born Fernando Martins de Bulhoes, was a Portuguese Catholic priest and friar of the Franciscan Order. He was born and raised by a wealthy family in Lisbon, Portugal, and died in Padua, Italy. Noted by his contemporaries for his powerful preaching, expert knowledge of scripture, and undying love and devotion to the poor and the sick, he was one of the most quickly canonized saints in church history. He was proclaimed a Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius XII on January 16, 1946.

The story of Anthony "preaching to the fish" originated in Rimini, where he had gone to preach. When heretics there treated him with contempt, Anthony was said to have gone to the shoreline, where he began to preach at the water's edge until a great crowd of fish was seen gathered before him. The people of the town flocked to see this marvel, after which Anthony charged them with the fact that the fish were more receptive to his message than the heretics of the church, at which point the people were moved to listen to his message.

In another often-told story, which took place in Toulouse, Anthony was challenged by a heretic to prove the reality of the presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The man, who sought to mock Anthony, brought out a half-starved mule and showed it fresh fodder on one hand, and the sacramental host on the other. The mule was said to have ignored the fodder and, instead of eating either, bowed before the sacrament.

Another account tells of an occasion in Italy when Anthony was dining with heretics. He realized the food they put before him was poisoned, and he confronted them. The men admitted to attempting to kill him, but then challenged him to eat if he truly believed the words spoken in Mark 16:18 about the apostles of Christ: "...and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them." Anthony is said to have blessed the food, eaten it, and suffered no harm, much to the amazement of his hosts.

He is especially invoked and venerated all over the world as the patron saint for the recovery of lost items and is credited with many miracles involving lost people, lost things and even lost spiritual goods.





The Nazareth Page, A gospel meditation for your home
June 12th, 2022 – The Most Holy Trinity
John 16:12-15

The greatest mystery everyone wonders about is that of the existence of God. This search for an answer to this mystery begins when we seek an understanding of ourselves. We ask questions about our own existence. Included in that search for understanding is often a question like who created the universe in the first place. For centuries humans asked these kinds of questions in many ways. We might be helped in our quest for understanding by insights gained from others living before us and those around us today.

The answers to the God question are many. Some say we can't know. They are labelled agnostics. Some say there's nothing beyond us. They are called atheists. If you are reading this, you are likely part of a third group, generally called believers. You accept an answer to life's deeper questions by affirming the existence of someone called "God."

Most believers claim that there is one God. We call them monotheists. Depending on one's cultural and religious roots and connections, belief in one God might use different names for God, like Abba or Allah or Yahweh or Buddha.

Today is Trinity Sunday. This way of describing God claims two things. First, there is but one God. But in the one God, there is multiplicity, sometimes described as "three persons in one God," If you find that difficult to understand, you are probably being both honest and accurate. After all, God is mystery.

For me, part of this mystery implies that like us, God lives (and has always lived) communally. Within the one God there is interaction, communication, plurality. The theologian, St. Augustine in the fifth century taught that in God there was God the lover, God the beloved, and God who is the love between them. I find that helpful, but not conclusive.

Here's what I find helpful in this "explanation." While there is one God, the Creator of all that is (including you and me), God's basic life is one of love. St. Paul will write that God is love. God loves us -- all of us. And we are invited to love God in return – the first commandment. And to love each other – the second commandment. In John's Gospel we read that God so loved the world that God became human and lived with us. And after Jesus died and rose from the dead and ascended into heaven, God "returned" to live with us as Spirit. Just like life in God, we are not alone. Never were and never will be.
