SAINT IGNATIUS OF ANTIOCH, FEAST DAY OCTOBER 17TH

Born in Syria, Ignatius converted to Christianity and eventually became Bishop of Antioch. In the year 107, Emperor Trajan visited Antioch and forced the Christians there to choose between death and apostasy. Ignatius would not deny Christ and thus was condemned to be put to death in Rome.

Ignatius is well known for the seven letters he wrote on the long journey from Antioch to Rome. Five of these letters are to churches in Asia Minor; they urge the Christians there to remain faithful to God and to obey their superiors. He warns them against heretical doctrines, providing them with the solid truths of the Christian faith.

The sixth letter was to Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna, who was later martyred for the faith. The final letter begs the Christians in Rome not to try to stop his martyrdom. "The only thing I ask of you is to allow me to offer the libation of my blood to God. I am the wheat of the Lord; may I be ground by the teeth of the beasts to become the immaculate bread of Christ."

Ignatius bravely met the lions in the Circus Maximus.

Ignatius' great concern was for the unity and order of the Church. Even greater was his willingness to suffer martyrdom rather than deny Christ. He did not draw attention to his own suffering, but to the love of God which strengthened him. He knew the price of commitment and would not deny Christ, even to save his own life.

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home October 16th, 2022 – 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 18:1-8

Today's gospel is one of my favorites. Jesus wanted to teach a lesson about persistence and prayer. He described a feisty widow who kept pestering a local judge about an injustice that was done to her by an "adversary." She wanted him to make a judgment "making things right." He didn't want to be bothered, so for a time he ignored her request. Day after day she appeared before him, repeating her need. Eventually he caved in and granted her request. Point of the parable: Don't quit if you know you are right.

Recently, I made of list of turning points that I experienced during my life. And I realized that, in general, if I was rejected by someone or given a negative response to a request, I often stepped back for a bit and then tried again. Maybe just repeated my request or created another approach. I recall an old saying: If you don't at first succeed, try and try again.

Being a writer, I have often received a dreaded rejection notice after submitting my brilliant words to a publisher. Just like it happens to 99% of prospective authors. J. K. Rowling, the author of the immensely successful Harry Potter books, was rejected by every publisher in England, where she lived. Dozens of them! She finally found an American publisher who has sold millions of her books. She didn't quit.

I have been part of a small number of theologians and church leaders who have advocated for greater support and appreciation of family life in various religious denominations and churches. It has been an uphill climb for decades.

Occasionally there are moments of satisfaction - like when Pope Francis wrote a treatise on joy in the family (*Amoris Latitia*) – but then there is the lukewarm acceptance it received and the millions of Catholics who have never read it. But those committed to this cause will not quit. Why? Probably for the same reason that widow repeatedly went to the courthouse with her request. They are not quitters.

We all have hopes and dreams that we judge as important and we all experience frustration when they are not realized. Not all those who heard the words of Jesus and even witnessed his mighty deeds took him seriously. Many walked away. But did he "throw in the towel" as we say? No, he continued his mission. Like the widow, he kept going. So should we.
