PRACTICE OF CHARITY

There is a hidden danger in today's Gospel. The depiction of disciples – you are the salt of the earth, you are the light of the world - can become too familiar. It can become too easy to congratulate ourselves for past good deeds that give glory to God. It is our task to let our light shine before others, not to describe it to them.

♥ Read the words of Isaiah again, asking yourself how your light might rise in the darkness

♥ Contemplate which needs of the world God is calling you to respond to. Call an agency in your community that does this work and ask what their most immediate needs are. Are the needs something you can fulfill? Could you ask people in your life to help you? One gift of light is that it illuminates the path for others to follow.

Spend time in silence, discerning what God may be asking you to do next.

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home January 29, 2023 – Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 5:1-12a

Today's gospel recalls for us of one of the key sections of the entire Bible: The Eight Beatitudes. They easily serve as an introduction or preamble to the full teachings of Jesus. Call it the heart of the gospels, a summary of the major teachings of Jesus or a summing up of the most important aspects of the Christian life. In a sense they are a parallel to the Ten Commandments, which are a summary of the moral teachings of the Hebrew Bible – what Christians call the Old Testament.

Before highlighting them, I want to contrast their message and values with what we view on daily television and in parts of the social media. I am referring to my least favorite parts of the mass media, namely, its continuous bombardment of viewers with commercials. I dislike most of them and thank God for inspiring inventors to create the "mute" button. Also, they often contain values at odds with our Christian ones.

Now for a few thoughts on this. I will contrast them with some of today's secular values.

Beatitude one: Blessed are the poor in spirit. Secular value: Blessed are those with the most money and power.

Beatitude two: Blessed are they who mourn. Secular value: Blessed are those who are happy all the time and care only about themselves.

Beatitude three: Blessed are the meek. Secular value: Blessed are the rough, the tough, the deceitful, the ungrateful and the powerful.

Beatitude four: Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. Secular value: Blessed are those who put themselves first and put down others.

Beatitude five: Blessed are the merciful. Secular value: Blessed are those who falsely judge others and seek punishment for them whenever possible.

Beatitude six: Blessed are the clean of heart. Secular value: Blessed are those who divide their hearts between those who agree with them and those who don't.

Beatitude seven: Blessed are the peacemakers. Secular value: Blessed are those are unkind to others and disregarding their needs.

Beatitude eight: Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness: Secular value: Blessed are those who try to escape responsibility and deny any judgment of their own faults and failures.

Returning to my original thought: carefully examine the values inherent in our current secular culture (and its promoters) and decide which path you take.
