Genesis 12:1-4a 2 Timothy 1:8b-10 Matthew 17:1-9 PRACTICE OF HOPE



The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home February 26, 2023 – First Sunday of Lent Matthew 4:1-11

This year at the beginning of Lent we hear Matthew's account of the temptations of Jesus. We are led to think about the wily ways used by the devil to tempt Jesus. We learn that in the end Jesus prevailed. Basic to these temptations was the devil's attempt to urge Jesus to act beyond the ordinary limits of human agency. To be more than human.

In this reflection I want to focus on a passage at the beginning of today's gospel: He fasted for forty days and forty nights and afterwards he was hungry." Of course, he was! Any of us would be. No food for forty days? That's not a diet; it's starvation.

After all, he was human. Perhaps in no other passage of the gospel is the humanity of Jesus more in evidence. Without food, humans feel hungry. Even after a day without food, we sense the pangs of hunger. It is an experience that is both physical and mental.

Many years back I earned a doctoral degree in theology. I have taught in various universities for decades. So now I assume my professorial role and based on today's gospel, I put forth the following question. Who is Jesus?

Many might answer, Jesus is the Son of God, the second person of the Blessed Trinity. And I would reply, yes, but that's only half right. Your grade is 50%, which wherever I taught was not a passing grade. A better answer is that Jesus besides being divine was and still is also human, though, as the Church has long taught, a human person without sin. But still, completely human.

So that he was hungry after his forty-day fast is a good starting point for affirming his human nature. He also had to learn how to do things. He was not born with the ability to read or write. He had to learn how to be a good son. He had to learn the difference between right and wrong. He had to learn a craft, which in his case was to become a carpenter from his dad.

And he also felt the limitations of being human like the pangs of hunger, the weight of worry and anxiety, the effort needed for endurance and achieving goals, the hardship of broken relationships and failed efforts, the fear of suffering and death. I like to think of Jesus as an older brother who has seen it all and felt it all too.
