#### Ezekiel 37: 12-14 Romans 8:8-11 John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45 PRACTICE OF HOPE

There is a danger embedded in our conviction that God can transform any suffering: rendering suffering meaningless. Sometimes we hear: "It's all for the best." "Everything happens for a reason." God has a plan." Jesus turns these platitudes on their heads when he raises Lazarus and states, "I am the resurrection and the life." Jesus, the Messiah, the Son of God, says unambiguously that he is the God of life. He does not will our suffering. He weeps with us as we grieve. He feels the separation of death. Authentic hope is something different than platitudes. It is a belief that in those moments when we most struggle, Jesus is there with us.

#### **CHRISM MASS INVITATION**

The Faithful of the Diocese of Helena are invited to attend Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Helena which will take place at Noon on Tuesday, March 28, 2023.

The Chrism Mass is a special celebration in the liturgical life of the Church in the Diocese of Helena. Bishop Vetter will bless the Holy Oils for use in the coming year and priests of the diocese will renew their priestly promises.


The Oil of the Sick is used in Sacrament of the Sick to bring the strengthening and healing power of Christ who is at work in the Church by the action of the Holy Spirit. The Oil of Catechumens is used at Baptism, to strengthen (with wisdom and courage to live the Gospel) and purify candidates (from original sin) before baptizing with water. The Oil of Chrism, or Sacred Chrism, is a mixture of olive oil and balsam fragrance used just after Baptism, and to seal candidates for Confirmation. It is also used to anoint the hands of priests and the heads of bishops at Ordination.

#### **INTO THE BREACH -FAITH FORMATION**

As we all know, our church is under attack by Satan. Over 14 million Catholics left the faith between 2000 – 2015. We celebrate fewer baptisms, fewer marriages, and there are fewer children in Religious Education classes. This is a serious breach, a gaping hole in Christ's battle lines.

The Knights of Columbus are inviting all Catholic men to put their faith into action by "stepping into the breach" – to fill this gap that lies open and vulnerable to further attack. The Knights will be sponsoring an 8-week program called *Into the Breach*, to be held on Monday nights at 7pm, beginning on April 10th. ### SYMBOLISM OF THE EASTER EGGS

The Easter egg is one of the most widely recognized Easter symbols, but because it has been widely secularized, we sometimes forget the Resurrection symbolism of the egg. Here is the explanation of the symbolism of the egg.

The custom of having Easter eggs is very widespread, so much so that the Christian meaning has been all but forgotten. Of course, these Easter eggs are symbols of the Risen Christ. As a chick breaks the shell when it is hatched and begins life, so Our Lord comes forth living from the tomb. Consequently, it is a good custom to paint figures of Christ, the Easter Lamb, etc. on the colored eggs. #### The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home March 19, 2023 – Fourth Sunday of Lent John 9:1-41

When I was fifty years old, while teaching at a Jesuit university, I was invited by a kindly Jesuit priest to take the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Loyola. I accepted his invitation. So, each day I would reflect and pray about a specific incident in the life of Jesus. The purpose of these daily "exercises" was to provide me with a more honest understanding of myself, and more importantly, increase my awareness of God's presence and love for me. (Actually, for all of us!) At the conclusion of these spiritual meditations about a year later, I was given the charge "to see God in all things."

Part of the wisdom upon which the exercises are based is that God is everywhere and involved in most all the events of our lives. In failing to recognize God's immediate presence, we suffer from spiritual blindness. We see surfaces but not the totality of all that is there. Recalling Graham Green's brilliant novel, *The Heart of the* Matter, we may overlook exactly that, the matter that is most important.

Sometimes we are too busy or distracted by other things or too focused on our own unmet needs or worried about what's going on in our own lives. This is not surprising given the many possible distractions filling our days. Our world today offers many possible ways we might suffer from missing or not attending to God's presence. Or even consciousness of ourselves and we move through each day. Partial awareness might also be called a form of "spiritual blindness."

So how might we be cured of this? First, it's important to recognize that we might easily suffer from impaired vision. If we don't "see" God's presence in us and around us, maybe it is because we are not looking for it.

Or perhaps we are simply preoccupied with other matters, like the need to keep updated on the latest news, emails, social media content and so forth. Or the many demands for our attention arising from family, home, work and a thousand other places. Some of these matters rightfully require our attention. They make up the central agenda of our being a responsible Christian, citizen, family member and good neighbor.

And God should be conscious part of all that. But again, are we seeing these matters as related to God's presence among us and with us and even in us? Seeing God requires a special kind of vision, but it's one that's available to all of us.
