The Nazareth Page A Gospel Meditation for the Home April 23, 2023, Third Sunday of Easter Luke 24:13-35

If you mark a map locating the various appearances of Jesus after he had risen from the dead, you will notice that they happen in a variety of places throughout what we call today, the Holy Land. Sometimes it happened behind locked doors (last week's gospel) and at times outside, like the one happening along a road outside Jerusalem. One place that he did not appear was at the quarters of Pontius Pilate.

Quite noteworthy too is the variety of activities he engaged in after the resurrection. I have two favorites. First, at the shore of the Sea of Galilee where he prepared breakfast for his disciples. And next in today's gospel,) with a couple as they walked away from Jerusalem to a town called Emmaus, which was a well-known stronghold for the Roman army – although this point is not made in the gospels. Nevertheless, there he suddenly appears to two walkers on that road. Some contemporary commentators suggest they might have been a married couple. (I like to think so as well.)

Every post-resurrection appearance has its idiosyncrasies. Today's gospel describes a scene where he appeared to those who didn't seem to recognize him. No explanation is given. They walked and talked with each other for a while and when they reached their destination, the couple invited him to stay with them and share supper. It was nearing sunset when it might have been dangerous to continue. All very understandable.

So, they stopped. They shared an evening supper that involved the breaking of bread. While the gospel gives few details, aside from their engaging in this time-honored custom, something remarkable suddenly happened. They recognized him. And they recalled what had recently happened in Jerusalem. He, Jesus, was the one who was crucified. And now he was sharing a meal with them. No more was recorded other than how they felt while with him. Almost poetically, they are described by Luke as having burning hearts. Later they told others. Likely that was how it became part of Luke's gospel.

It is important to note that Jesus chose to appear after his resurrection during meals. There's the breakfast on the beach in Galilee and dinner at Emmaus. We can also recall his Last Supper. And on his way into Jerusalem before that meal, we recall that delightful account of him inviting himself to enjoy supper at the home of the local tax collector, Zacchaeus. What I notice is that Jesus was never described as eating alone. Sharing food seemed a time to feel the sacred presence of God. Then and now!!!
