### PENTECOST

This weekend, the Church celebrates Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year that concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the Church.

#### The timing and origins of Pentecost

Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Because Easter is a moveable feast without a fixed date, and Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter, Pentecost can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13.

#### What happens at Pentecost?

In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. It was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk - but Peter pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations. It fulfills the New Testament promise from Christ (Luke 24:46-49) that the Apostles would be "clothed with power" before they would be sent out to spread the Gospel.

## The Nazareth Page A Gospel meditation for your home May 21, 2023 – The Ascension of the Lord Matthew 28:16-20

We have new eyes on the universe around us. And one of the most important things we are looking for is part of what's described as the exoplanet survey, the effort to find planets orbiting distant stars. As of now we have identified well over 5000 planets and that number increases each day. Some astronomers suspect that there are millions of planets.

And once found, we are currently evaluating the possibility that some of these planets may have life on their surface. It is a search as to whether conditions are such that could create the *presence* of living creatures. And a central part of that search is an answer to an old question: Are we alone? Or do we have some neighbors in the vast universe where we live? If we learn that we do ... wow!

I have highlighted the word *presence because* it is such an important idea. Philosophers and psychologists point out that our sense and awareness of what and/or who is present around us is a central human concern. And a very important aspect of that question came to the first followers of Jesus after his death. Part of their question was answered after the resurrection and then again, on this week's feast, the Ascension of Jesus. So where did he go? And secondly, is God in Jesus no longer here?

There are multiple answers to that question, but they all relate to the matter of whether God is present or absent to us. Are we deprived of God being with us? Or did Jesus really leave us?

As one who has wondered about this question and studied it for many decades, I'll give you a few of my thoughts. First, God is always and everywhere with us, as creator and sustainer of all that is seen and unseen. And the same I would say about the presence of Jesus. As Catholics we believe that Jesus is present in the Eucharist, in the bread transformed, in the Word of God proclaimed and preached, and in the people of faith gathered.

Further, God is also with us in all our interpersonal relationships: where two of three are gathered, said Jesus, I am there. That's why I often refer to family and friends. And finally, from today's gospel (a critical turning point) we read, "I am with you always until the end of the age." And a last thought, words from a favorite hymn: Where charity and love prevail, there God is ever found." Yes, God is present to us always. The only guestion worth considering: Am I present to God?
