

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home May 28, 2023 – Pentecost Sunday John 20:19-23

A common fear among parents is the safety of their children, both those that are young, and even those who have reached adulthood. As a parent and grandparent myself, I can testify that my worries about our children and grandchildren never end. We certainly want to know of their accomplishments, their adventures and their health, but these days especially we are also concerned for their safety.

One of the most important benefits from the new technologies of communication is that family members can stay in touch with each other. We usually can have a general sense of where each family member is and what they are doing. We can learn who needs help of any kind. When we don't hear from each other, we worry. In fact, a lack of communication is surely among the deepest pains associated with parenting these days. We can fear all kinds of dangers. In general, none of us want to be alone or forgotten, unacknowledged or unloved.

In today's gospel we recall the situation faced by the first disciples of Jesus. The authorities had just executed Jesus on false charges. They wondered if they were next. They hid in a locked facility wondering what was next.

Suddenly Jesus was there among them. No details are given as to how this occurred except suddenly he was there, still showing the marks of his terrible death. He was alive and he was there to calm their fears although his sudden appearance likely scared some of them. (I know that I would have been somewhat terrified.)

He told them that they would receive God's Holy Spirit. And as a way of doing this, the gospel states that "he breathed on them." (Perhaps a reference to how the Book of Genesis described God's action in creating the universe when God breathed over the primal waters.) Further, breathing is a sign of living presence, life-giving action.

Mostly, Jesus wanted to assure them of God's continued presence in them, an accompaniment that would also bring hope during the days to follow. Which includes each of us in our lives. Some have observed, however, that our connection with God's Holy Spirit doesn't seem to make much of a difference to many. They call the Holy Spirit "a forgotten member of the Holy Trinity." Maybe we need a reminder to pray for the Holy Spirit to come and fill our hearts with love. Since God's Spirit is already in us, we won't have to travel far to make this prayer.
