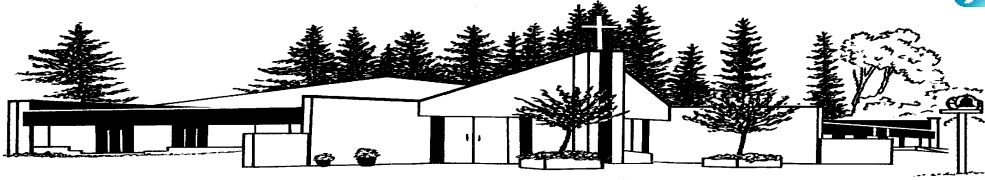

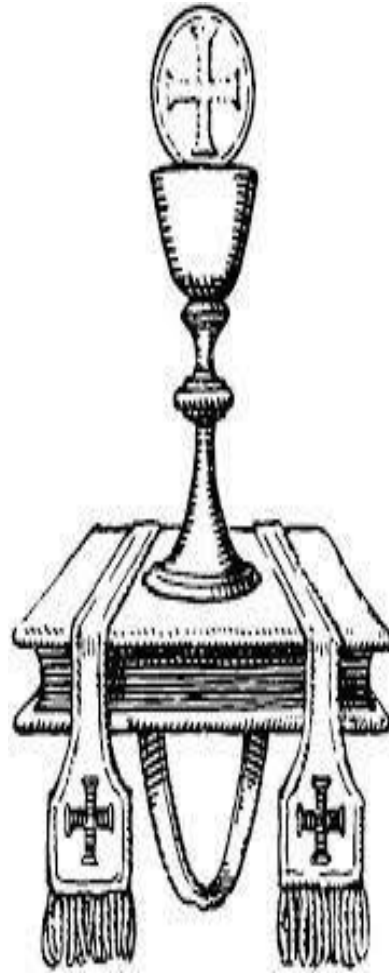

Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 14b-16a 1 Corinthians 10:16-17 John 6:51-58

PRACTICE OF CHARITY

So much about being Christian is about inexorable commitment, and nothing demonstrates that as starkly as the Eucharistic meal. As Paul explained, when we partake, we participate. We become one with each other in Christ, now committed to his mission and to each other in the most profound way. One must be accountable to what one is becoming, and so to what one is doing, when receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. Too often we forget that this commitment inevitably involves some sacrifice – participation in the body means participation in the blood, as well.

♦This Sunday, if you are in the habit of receiving only the Body of Christ at Communion, receive from the cup as well, if you are able.

♦Pray about what it means to drink from this cup. Consider volunteering to take Communion to the homebound from your parish. At Home With the Word 2023

Moms and Dads with youngsters: Please consider helping with Children's Liturgy at Mass on Sunday mornings. Being a leader is enjoyable and easy.

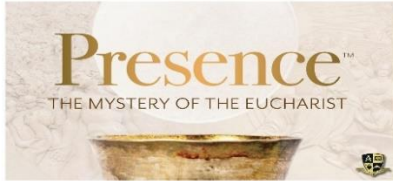
There is an initial Virtus training which takes approximately 2 hours of training.

The Nazareth Page

*A gospel meditation for your home
June 4, 2023 – The Most Holy Trinity
John 3:16-18*

We seem to like lists that inform us as to what is the best thing to buy for our aging car, the best toothpaste for whiter teeth or the best fast-food restaurant that offers healthy food at reasonable prices. In that spirit, I suggest here that while today's gospel is brief, it offers us some of the most important words in the entire Bible! It described the "personality" of God, something we all wonder about. In brief, we are told that God loves us, and that God so loved us that God came to live with us in the person of Jesus.

That meant that God, in the person of the human Jesus, lived here, was conceived, and born here, grew up here, loved those he encountered each day. God, as one of us, worked and played with us, learned from those he encountered, listened to their concerns, and responded with his wisdom. God in Jesus cared for the sick and needy, taught the truth concerning what was most important for us, criticized those who abused the weak and powerless and was eventually arrested, falsely judged, and executed as a criminal. But there was more. Jesus, divine and human, was then resurrected with new life and continues to live among us.

This Sunday we are also invited to think about God in a very personal way. While we believe that there is but one God, we also believe that within God there is what we can call "interpersonal life." And while this understanding of God is a challenge for us to understand in its fullness, we can appreciate some of this truth by reflecting on the incredible importance of loving relationships in our world, and hopefully, in our own lives.

We are invited to think of God's love as personal, focused on each of us. God's love is not simply a generic love for all humanity, but specific and truly personal. You and I are fully known and loved not just as members of the human community, or even as simply being a member of a community like the church. No, God's love goes deeper than that. God knows and loves you in all your uniqueness as a person.

In a sense, God knew you before you were conceived. While you and I came into the world through human agency, it was God who wanted each of us to be. And God continues to be with you during every moment of your existence. Because God loves you, you are given the gift of life each day, and each moment of every day. While we may forget about this accompaniment (a favorite word of Pope Francis), we are all constantly sustained and loved day after day. Forever!
