PRIOR TO THE MASS

- ♦We should be predisposed to participate fully in the Mass, and to anticipate the reception of our Lord in Holy Communion. If we are in a state of mortal sin, we should go to confession prior to the Mass.
- ♦We should abstain from food and drink, except for water and medicine, at least one hour before receiving Holy Communion.
- ♦We should dress appropriately. Do not wear shorts, caps, compression pants, leggings, sleeveless top, etc.
- ♦We should not be late for the start of Mass. It is good to have some minutes of prayerful silence before the Mass actually starts.
- ♦Upon entering the church or chapel, we have come into a holy place. As such, we should do the following:
- ◆Maintain silence. Be in a prayerful posture.
- ♦Turn off cell phones and other gadgets.¹
- •Genuflect before going into the pew.



The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home June 11, 2023 – The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) John 6:51-58

Our family is currently like many others of our age. It can rightly be described as "scattered." Yet we try to stay in touch by phone and "messaging," a word that hardly existed a few years back. But that distancing does not mean we are never together. We still can travel, and when we do enjoy a family reunion with many or all of us, it's a very meaningful gathering.

As a family we do not have an abundance of regular rituals. This does not mean we are without "habits of the heart." Yet our family times together are more spontaneous, unscripted, open to surprise. But we do have one ritual which is required and tied to the need for nourishment. We call it "our family meal." And within that gathering, there are what might be called "sub-rituals." It has it oddities, but having existed for decades, it feels comfortable and quite significant, at least for us.

To assure full participation of every family member in the meal, we take turns articulating what we call "positives and negatives." That gives everyone a voice and a hearing. In some ways, it is the most important part of the meal. To connect this with today's gospel reading, it's our bread and wine. It our way of being present to each other. Just as Jesus did with his followers.

Jesus created a new kind of ritual meal at his "Last Supper." He transformed ordinary bread and wine into his body and blood. Then he instructed those there that he would be with them. This has been happening now for 2,000 years.

This very special "Christian family meal" has taken on many forms over time. Among Catholics today it is often commonly referred to simply as "Mass" or the celebration of the Eucharist. It is done in countless cultures and languages around the world. During its enactment, we remember and place ourselves in the presence of the saving death and resurrection of Jesus. And we recommit ourselves to our roles in the continued transformation of human life and creation as God had initiated most fully in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

Because "attending" Mass is done regularly by many, it is important to recommit ourselves to the importance of the Eucharist in our lives. We want to avoid habitual thinking that lacks significance and depth. We need reminders of its importance, like today.
