Kings 4:8-11, 14-16a Romans 6:3-4, 8-11 Matthew 10:37-42

PRACTICE OF FAITH

Jesus makes some uncomfortable statements in today's Gospel: We must love nothing – even our children – more than we love him, and we must lose our lives for his sake. In the face of this declaration, it's natural to ask: If this is the path, why am I on it? Paul says that the answer is nothing less than complete "newness of life." Absorbed through baptism into Christ's death, we now share in his resurrection. A "newness" is what Jesus is asking for, a reorientation in what we have been taught to value. Nothing in our lives, now or to come, offers us the promise that Jesus does. Ask yourself, why am I Christian? Seen through the lens of my Christian identity, what things do I value that I shouldn't? Pray each night this week for someone, living or dead, who has given their lives to service of the Gospel. Support a Catholic mission with prayer, time, or a donation. If you have children, involve them in these efforts.




St. Josemaria Escriva | Catholic Saints

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home June 25, 2023 – Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 10:26-33

Whenever I read this Sunday's gospel, I smile. That's because it described Jesus telling his followers that God knows all of us intimately, so much so that God even knows the number of hairs on our heads. My grin is rooted (a good word here) in the fact that by age forty my scalp was mostly devoid of hair. Baldness runs in my family, and I succumbed to its "curse" in early adulthood. When I took note of that, I took a positive approach. I saved money on having to buy unnecessary shampoo.

But returning to the main point that Jesus was making, if God even knows us in that detail, God's awareness of us is incredibly detailed and complete. Today we might say that God knows all the cells of our bodies, all billions of them.

Further in today's gospel Jesus also informs us that God deeply values us, every one of us now living on Earth, along with all those who proceeded us. That's many billion humans. Not to get bogged down by details, God's love and concern likely includes countless others too. In other words, there is no such thing as indifference in God concerning the miracle of Creation. God knows it in detail and cares about it continuously. God is never distant, and we dwell in God's heart. Hardly anything I can think about is more amazing than that!

So, asking God to be present to us is unnecessary because God is always close by. To use the words of St. Augustine, God is closer to us than we are to ourselves. I can think of nothing more remarkable than that!

Given these details about God as taught by Jesus, we might wonder about prayers that seem to imply that God is addressed as being distant or needing a reminder to come close to us or to turn in our direction. Granted that we might be led to imagine God as distant or indifferent, if we take seriously the words of Jesus, we should dismiss such views and affirm God's immediate presence, acknowledged or not. Admittedly, I often forget that God is with me, and that God loves me as I am. I suspect that's a common condition.

So, this week is a good time to reaffirm these truths of our faith. Take a few quiet moments each day to "place yourself in the presence of God." This can be challenging given the many distractions that come our way, invited or not. Don't worry that God may get too close to you because God is already there, aware of your presence, thinking about your difficulties and hoping that we will do our best to live as our loving God intends.
