PRACTICE OF FAITH

Today's Gospel upends the notion that the wise and powerful of the world have the advantage over the rest of us when it comes to God. He is "known" only through the Son, apprehended by the heart rather than the head. And in the heart, meekness and humility must reign. In a sense, Jesus is thanking God for giving him the "burden" of powerlessness, and asking us to imitate him, trusting as a child, so we can discover that God's will is a weight we will gladly carry. •Children who live in poverty often become more food insecure in the summer months; look for ways to help these children in your community. •Ask God to open your heart to his will. Find a quiet place and spend thirty minutes in contemplative prayer, in which you set down any burdens and rest in Jesus. •Learn from a child by asking how God cares for them.

The Nazareth Page A gospel meditation for your home July 2, 2023 – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 10:37-42

Today's gospel includes many one-liners. I will discuss two of them which seem especially worthwhile and important for ordinary Christians who live typical lives with family and friends and neighbors. The first passage reminds me of the always and everywhere timeliness of living our commitment to God as followers of Jesus. And the second points to what kind of everyday actions qualify as great expressions of Christian holiness.

A passage familiar to most of us is the invitation of Jesus to take up our cross daily and follow him. The "cross" he points to is not the one he carried to the top of Calvary. Rather it is made up of the challenges we face each and every day of our lives. I have a friend who suffers from a rare condition called post-polio syndrome. He is elderly but suffered the disease as a child before vaccines were available. The uninvited resurrection of the virus now eliminates his ability to stand and walk. His "daily" cross is apparent. As it is with others suffering chronic disabilities of all kinds.

If we honesty reflect on our own daily lives, we will likely be able to name all kinds of "crosses" that are offered to us each day. That's the nature of things. Life can be hard, no matter what. Some the these "crosses" are physical, some are social, some are of mental. Some involve regrets from our past or worries about our future or present challenges.

Taking up one's cross involves acceptance of what we daily encounter and our personal effort to improve things. The nature of taking up one's cross will be unique to each of us. Doing so with an accepting spirit, along with an effort to improve life in our world. Recall the Serenity Prayer used in AA meetings: "God, give me the grace to accept with serenity the things that cannot be changed, courage to change the things which should be changed, and the wisdom to know the difference." That's a very realistic prayer about daily crosses.

The other passage for today's gospel that is worth some thought involves the invitation to give a cup of water to a thirsty child, something many of us have done without much thought. Yet this act is a specific response to a survival need of someone needing help. It is a symbolic act of helping another survive. It's not dramatic. It doesn't make the news of the day. But it points to how interdependent we are for helping others in the daily pursuit of survival. And with Jesus mentioning this, it also suggests that nothing we do to help others is insignificant in creating God's reign here on earth. Everything counts – forever. David M. Thomas, PhD
