THE SILVER ROSE

The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends on Dec. 12th, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. During that time, Silver Roses travel from town to town along eight routes throughout North America. Several of those routes begin in Canada and end in Mexico.

The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose, a real, live one, was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12th, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.

In 2001, when Carl Anderson, Past Supreme Knight of the Knights of Columbus, expanded the Silver Rose Program, he commented: "Through the Silver Rose Program we honor not only Our Lady of Guadalupe and express the



unity of the Knights of Columbus, but we also reaffirm the Order's dedication to the sanctity of human life. It is to the Blessed Mother that we turn in prayer as we work to end the Culture of Death that grips our society. As we think in terms of 'One Life, One Rose', it is most appropriate that we turn to Our Lady of Guadalupe who made known her will through Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses."

The Silver Rose will be at St. Matthew's Church on May 12, 2024, Mother's Day. On May 12th, a Rosary will be said before the 11:00 am Mass starting at 10:30 am.



The Nazareth Page A Gospel meditation for your home May 5, 2024 – Sixth Sunday of Easter John 15:9-17

I begin this reflection with the opening words of Jesus recorded in this Sunday's gospel. They are among the most important words he ever said. "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love." That is a profound summary of the truth that inspires the entirety of the Bible. They also form the foundation for your life and mine. In fact, all that lives, that ever were, that exist right now and will be in the future.

We are all created because we are loved by God. And we are shown how to live responding to that love through the example of Jesus. Our task is to believe this and accept being unconditionally loved by God. And live each day in response to that love. We are loved into life by God who intentionally created each of us and will love you and me forever. This is not a generalized love, like one may have for a favorite team or cause, but one that is *personal.* God knows you and God knows me and despite our weaknesses, failures and faults God persistently loves each of us.

Now add to this truth about our origins a thought from the much-respected scientist and theologian, Thomas Berry (1914-2009). "The universe, by definition, is a single glorious celebratory event." This means that all God's creation is an enactment and expression of God's love. Which leads us to our valuing all creation and preserving it as God intends.

Of course, we all can admit that everything does not always seem good, and much of what happens in our world does not seem "loving." There are abundant reasons for possibly denying the presence of God's love in our world. Recall that Jesus on the cross expressed doubt about God's presence and love for him. He felt abandoned and alone. Just as we do when times get tough and positive explanations of what's happening in our lives fail us. Clearly, we all experience both ups and downs, successes and failures, good days and even some terrible ones. So "remaining in God's love" is far from simple or easy. But that's also a clue to its importance.

Almost everything in our lives that is really important often requires our most strenuous effort. There are times when all of us are "stretched to our limits." When the only way to continue is to take up our burden, our cross, and follow Jesus. Biblical scholars call such words "the hard sayings of Jesus." Like when he said that we should love our enemies and do good to those who hate us. How difficult is that? This is not feel-good religion. Words that have most touched me in this regard are those at the end of the musical version of *Les Miserables*: "To love another person is to see the face of God."

A Letter from the Catholic Bishops of Montana on the Abortion Amendment Constitutional Initiative (CI-128)

Dear People of God,

As Catholics, we treasure life as a precious gift from God and recognize our sacred duty to nurture and protect every human life from the moment of conception through natural death. Created in the image of God with a dignity not of our own making, each person is a unique and unrepeatable masterpiece of God's creation. This recognition of the infinite dignity enjoyed by all persons informs our understanding of the basic rights and protections to which all human beings are entitled. When those rights are threatened, the Church must speak up with clarity and boldness.

At this very moment, there is a coordinated effort underway to gather signatures to place an extreme amendment to our State's constitution on the November ballot. Constitutional Initiative 128 (CI-128) would greatly expand the practice of legalized abortion in Montana abolishing the limited restrictions currently in place and opening the door to a host of practices that violate fundamental rights to life and dignity.

CI-128 is being promoted simply as a protection for women's rights, when in fact, this initiative seeks to enshrine legal authorization for the following:

- Late-term abortion of babies who will feel pain
- Abortion of babies who have been partially delivered
- · Abortion by dismemberment of children growing in the womb

Moreover, this proposal would eliminate current parental notification requirements that apply when minors obtain an abortion. This would:

- · Impose a culture of secrecy that would undermine families
- Expose underage mothers to exploitation
- Provide cover for those who would victimize underage women by committing abuse, human trafficking, and other crimes

Faced with this unprecedented threat to human life, we urge all people of goodwill to decline to sign the petition to place this dangerous amendment on our ballot. Trusting in God, we invite all Montanans to pray for the defeat of this Constitutional Initiative and stand in defense of women, children and all those threatened by this extreme proposal.
