"The Church's obligation to participate in shaping the moral character of society is a requirement of our faith. It is a basic part of the mission we have received from Jesus Christ, who offers a vision of life revealed to us in Sacred Scripture and Tradition." Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility, United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2023.

Signature gatherers for the petition to place Constitutional Initiative 128 (CI-128) on Montana's November ballot have now submitted their petition forms to county election administrators. Within four weeks of receiving statewide petition forms, election administrators must check the names of all petition signers to verify they are registered voters in their county. Petition signatures will be compared with voter registration signatures and then verified signature sheets will be submitted to the Secretary of State, no later than July 19. If there are sufficient verified signatures filed, the Secretary of State will certify that the petition has qualified for the ballot.

As we await the final signature count and verification, Montana's Catholic bishops urge us to continue praying for the defeat of CI-128, the protection of all human life, and the conversion of heart to which God calls all of us. Whatever the outcome of this initiative process, the Church will remain vigilant in boldly proclaiming the truth about human life and working to build a culture that upholds the infinite dignity of every person.

READINGS FOR THE FOURTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME July 7, 2024

Ezekiel 2:2-5 Corinthians 12:7-10 Mark 6:1-6
PRACTICE OF HOPE

Today we hear about the challenges that come with the call to be prophetic, the call to live a Christian life.

- ♦ The prophet Ezekiel is told that he will be sent to the Israelites, who are "hard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). The Lord tells Ezekiel that he is to proclaim the Lord's words to them regardless of their resistance. Jesus is also faced with this skepticism; the people of his hometown struggle to believe how he, one of their own impoverished and marginalized neighbors, can be a wise teacher. But St. Paul reminds us that God's grace is sufficient to help us proclaim God's truth: the power of Christ dwells in our weakness.
- ♦ Put yourself in the shoes of the Nazarenes. Say a prayer for someone who has been a prophetic voice for you.

The Nazareth Page A Gospel meditation for your home June 30, 2024 – Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 5:21-43

A parent worries about a sick daughter. A woman who has spent all her savings on ineffective doctors is frustrated and seemingly is about to give up. They come to Jesus seeking assistance. It is early in his public life, but already people are beginning to notice that he is different. He is committed to helping those in need. He cares. Perhaps he can help. And he does. But not to draw attention and fame on himself. But simply to help when help is sought.

Notice that there is a certain style in the life and ministry of Jesus. He rarely calls attention to himself. Rather, he reminds people that God (whom he describes in unusually familiar family terms) is loving, compassionate, caring. And always present. There is no mention of any divine hostile judgment, revenge, or anger.

By simply touching the corner of his gown (typical Middle Eastern garb) the woman's body is restored to health. Without fanfare he heals the sick child. He does not wait around for applause. In fact, he slips away unnoticed almost hiding from the amazed crowd. That's his style. His mission is not about himself but about giving a clear, and perhaps new to many, sense of God as concerned and loving. Later, he will inform his followers that it can flow through them as well. So be on the lookout for opportunities to make God's care and concern real each day to others, especially to those close by.

After I graduated from high school, I decided to enter a Catholic seminary to prepare myself to be ordained a priest. During my years there I decided that I might also be called to serve the church as what was then called "a foreign missionary." A year before I was to be ordained, I was invited to reconsider my vocation, which soon led to my return home. I was called an ex-seminarian. A relative liked to call me a "drop out." My missionary orientation changed from distant Africa to the town in Indiana where I grew up.

But in a sense, nothing deep down changed. As so many, I was still trying to imitate the life and the mission of Jesus, but now in a very local sense. And that orientation has lasted for the last sixty-five years. I now know that our call to continue the healing ministry of Jesus begins right where we are. In the families we are part of, the community in which we live, in everyday encounters with others. Just like with Jesus, people will come and go in our lives. We try to make God's presence and love touch them. Just like that day described in today's gospel.
