EPIPHANY BLESSING "CHALKING THE DOOR 2025"



20 + C + M + B + 25 MAY CHRIST BLESS THIS DWELLING PLACE

Each year, around the feast of the Epiphany, many parishes around the world participate in an annual blessing of chalk. An ancient tradition places God at the entrance of your home and your entire family under his protection.

The Epiphany blessing of chalk and homes is a centuries-old tradition where priests visit each family in their parish after the Feast of Epiphany. Over time, it became more difficult for priests to see all the homes of their parish. Thus, it became an accepted tradition that a household member could lead this blessing instead of the priest.

Using the Blessed Chalk, mark the lintel of your front door (or porch step as follows):

20 + C + M + B + 25 while saying:

The three Wise Men, Casper, Melchior, and Balthazar, followed God's Son's star, who became human two thousand and twenty-five years ago. May Christ bless our home and remain with us throughout the new year. Amen

Then, offer the following prayer: Visit, O Blessed Lord, this home with the gladness of your presence. Bless all who live or visit here with the gift of your love; grant that we may manifest our love to each other and all whose lives we touch. May we grow in grace and your knowledge and love, guide, comfort, and strengthen us in peace, O Jesus Christ, now and forever. Amen.



The Nazareth Page - A Gospel meditation for your home December 29, 2024 –The Holy Family Luke 2:41-52

Today's gospel, while written nearly 2,000 years ago, has a distinct contemporary feel to it. Like many, I've read it countless times. And it's a gospel story that once you hear it, it sticks. It describes a time when Jesus, then entering young adulthood, accompanies his parents, Mary and Joesph, to a major religious gathering in Jerusalem. For companionship and safely, pilgrims coming to that feast travelled in groups. Joseph and Mary left Jerusalem in separate groups, but when they caught up with each other, they immediately became extremely worried because their son, Jesus, was with neither of them.

They hurried back to Jerusalem and were clearly surprised to find him with the teachers (rabbis) of the temple, deeply involved in a religious conversation with them. When they

Mary and Joseph, admonished him for causing them great worry, it seems from the

gospel's account, that he dismissed their worry. Didn't they know that he had to do

certain things that came from one more important than them? It is suggested in the

gospel that the parents were confused by his response and thus began Mary's

pondering about the "mystery" of the identity of Jesus.

This story reminds me of a meditation written by Kahlil Gibran, a Lebanese poet, in his beautiful book called *The Prophet*. His message to parents is a reminder that our children are not totally our own, but they belong to God, a deeper source of their existence. They are not our possession or our property but are only given to us by God to receive our care and our love, but in the end, they are to be responsive to the Spirit of life, the Creator. And there may be times when what they do, and the direction they go, may not coincide with the one we parents would choose for them. Sound familiar?

Being a good and faithful parent is far from easy. Some would say it's the most difficult vocation of all to do well. This is not just because we are all creatures living complicated and often confusing lives, but more deeply, because we are all beholden to the direction given us by God's Spirit that dwells within each of us. Allow me to use an image that captures some of this complexity.

God is the ultimate source of each of us. And God writes the music for each one's part in the Great Symphony of life. We must play the music that God has written for each of us. Sometimes those close to us play the same notes as we do, but sometimes they play a different set of notes, some harmonizing with ours, but some may even sound to us as discord. Like when Jesus stayed at the temple without his parents.
