

PRACTICE OF CHARITY

In today's familiar Gospel, Jesus imparts to his disciples, and all of us, a rule of conduct sometimes called the golden rule: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31). Societies are structured to preserve secular justice, while Jesus instructs us to seek spiritual justice.

† Learn about the restorative justice approach to resolving conflict and harm done between individuals. Are there elements of the process that you could adopt in your life?

A practice proven to foster forgiveness for someone who has hurt you is to pray for them daily. Stay faithful to the habit and take note of how God transforms your heart.
Follow the Lord's example and embrace the virtue of mercy. Feed the hungry. Clothe the homeless. Visit the imprisoned. It is hard to hold on to judgment for those for whom you perform a work of mercy. At Home with the Word 2025

Lenten Practices:

Prayer-Prayer purifies the mind and opens the intellect to the light of Christ's truth so, above all, whatever way you pray best, do more of it. "Doing more" in prayer doesn't always mean spending more time praying. Prayer is not another project on our list of things to do. The best prayer is the kind that takes a little time out of the business of life to ask God for what we need and imbue our lives with a divine perspective.

Fasting- Don't neglect this practice during Lent—in fact, do more than the minimum the Church requires because it's good for the soul! The discipline of fasting is valuable because it reorders the disordered emotions and appetites of our inner life. Fasting literally makes us more spiritual because when our stomachs complain that we are not feeding them, we are reminded that God *is feeding us* with His grace and mercy. We are a body/soul unity, and physical fasting has a powerful spiritual effect on the soul.

Charity-We mature spiritually by making sacrifices for higher goods and purposes. Charity is not just giving material gifts to others, it is a matter of training the will to sacrifice our own attachments for the sake of others. Almsgiving/charity trains us to think and act generously as a way of life and to get away from an obsessive concern about our own needs.


Personal Apostolate
